



PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

The fall has been filled with events. I said in the last issue that I was certain the 50th Anniversary would be a success and it was. We also had a terrific Harvest Bazaar. Thank you again to the Torcomians, Mukalians and to the Harmons for leading those efforts and thank you, really thank you, to each person who provides any support whatsoever to our events.



In that vein, we have been debating at Parish Council meetings the issue of whether to list the names of our Members in good standing, meaning those in the Congregation that are then current in their dues payment. Two schools of thought appear: (1) listing the names has the effect of ostracizing those who are not members; and (2) identifying members of an organization is commonplace and is an innocuous event. Think about it when you can.

If you are not a member of the Church and you express strong opinions about certain issues and particularly those issues that involve the Church spending money, do the persons on the other side of your debate deserve to know whether you are a member or not? For example, we, as the P.C, have determined to do the following on, drumroll.....the "Elevator

Issue." We formed a committee as organizations always do, and the committee consists of Der Hayr, Larry D. Der Hagopian and Merle Santerian. I found that group to reflect an appropriate cross-section of our Church community and that we therefore assure that each part of the demographic population of our Church is represented in the process.

We then engaged an architect and agreed to pay him up to \$5,000.00 to prepare an analysis of the placement of any elevator in the building, the various costs of an elevator, including the construction costs and professional fees surrounding the elevator, and to provide a recommendation. The P.C. will then review that analysis and make its recommendation to the Parish to be considered at the next Assembly. The P.C. will provide the Parish with the information from the architect in advance of the Assembly.

At the Assembly, eligible voting Members (again, those in the Congregation then current with their dues) can either vote on the elevator issue or determine how to otherwise proceed. As a further part of the dialogue, I want to propose to the Parish, again, in advance of the Assembly, that the Church will commit to providing a percentage portion of the monies

needed for the elevator. We have not yet determined the percentage, but we will. The Church will then turn to the Parish to fund the balance of the project, should it proceed.

The costs associated with the project, from the initial quotes, may reach a figure that is more than ten percent of our investments. That is a significant amount of money and a significant amount of our resources. We need to make that type of decision with deliberation and without emotion. Our decisions to spend money affect our Church community in many ways, but most significantly, (1) we cannot make decisions entirely from our hearts; and (2) we have to consider the longer term



for our children and grandchildren. As I have said before, we have been fortunate to have literally a few families that gave us 50% of our invested money and the pipeline project which gave us the rest. There has not been other significant giving.

When we decide this issue, and I really do not have a preference on whether we do the project or not, I ask respectfully that we consider the sources of the money we are voting to spend, or not. The Ananian Family gifts and all of the other church families' gifts that comprise our investments are going to be depleted. We need to consider how we are going to restore those monies. Some may think - I am a member, I pay dues and I am voting and that is that. We have to consider, however, that again, we have a responsibility to the Church and a responsibility to the persons who gave to respect their gifts and to honor those in whose memory those gifts were made. Each of us has had a baptism, or a wedding, or a death and our gifts for each of those events is a part of the money we are voting to spend. It is not an imaginary pool of money. It is our money, yours and mine.

SHARING FAMILY NEWS





1 Peter 3:21

On February 21 (two days before Vartanantz), the Armenian Church commemorates the group of saints called Levontian Fathers.

The following is a reflection by Deacon Albert Keshgegian:

Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, and into an inheritance that can never perish, spoil or fade – kept in heaven for you, who through faith are shielded by God's power until the coming of the salvation that is ready to be revealed in the last time. In this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while you may have had to suffer grief in all kinds of trials. These have come so that your faith – of greater worth than gold, which perishes even though refined by fire – may be proved genuine and may result in praise, glory and honor when Jesus Christ is revealed. Though you have not seen him you love him; and even though you do not see him now you believe in him and are filled with an inexpressible and glorious joy, for you are receiving the goal of your faith, the salvation of your souls. 1 Peter 1:3-9

A diamond doesn't become brilliant, hard and precious until after many years of intense heat and pressure. Gold must be melted at high temperatures in order to remove impurities before it can be made into beautiful jewelry. Iron must be heated in a blast furnace to remove impurities and form the alloys that make steel strong, tough, and so useful. So it is sometimes with our faith.

Our faith is of greater worth to God than gold, more precious than diamonds, more useful than steel. But sometimes circumstances combine to test our faith. Trials come into our lives, bringing times of adversity. These may lead us to question the promises of God or even his very existence. But just as diamonds, gold, and steel become harder, more beautiful, and more useful by the processes they must go through, so also our faith can become stronger and be proved genuine by going through trials in our lives.

God helps us get through these times of trial by shielding us in his power, helping us to keep our faith, until the day that Christ returns. God gave us his son Jesus and he, through his resurrection, gave us a gift that is perfect. A gift that will never perish, spoil, or fade. A gift that is being kept in heaven for us who have faith: the salvation of our souls and eternal life with God. Our faith assures us of this gift and fills us with inexpressible and glorious joy in anticipation of receiving it, no matter what trials we may be facing in our lives.

The Levontian Fathers felt this joy, even though their lives were filled with great adversity. This group of clergymen lived at the time of the Battle of Vartanantz. They are named after the priest Levontius (Ghevont Yerets) and also include Catholicos Hovsep, Bishops Sahag and Tatig, Priests Mousheh, Arshen, Manuel, Abraham, and Khoren, and Deacons Kachach and Abraham.

The Levontian Fathers participated in the Council of Artashat, which wrote the reply to the demands of the Persian king that Armenians adopt paganism. As part of that reply St. Vartan and his followers said to the king:

We are ready to serve you; we are ready to put to your disposition all we have; we are even ready to fight for you and to shed our blood for the empire...but when it comes to our eternal salvation, there is nothing you or your priests can do...your religion is a lie and should be laughed at...ours alone is true and teaches the love of God and of men...we cannot worship the sun and the moon and the wind and fire.

Ghevont Yerets was one of the primary leaders against the Persian king. He had led an uprising against the Persian priests who had come to Armenia to convert churches into fire temples. Before the Battle of Vartanantz he addressed the soldiers and exhorted them to sacrifice themselves for the sake of God's immortal power, as Jesus had sacrificed himself for us. Ghevont Yerets has been called the soul of the movement of Christian resistance.

The Levontian Fathers were martyred in the wilderness (so that their people could not obtain their relics) a few years after the Vartanantz battle, on July 25, 454. They were martyred for the strength of faith and their love for the Armenian nation.

Christian Armenia has continued to face adversity through the years. Persians were followed by Arabs, who in turn were followed by Turks, and, most recently, communists. Centuries of domination and subjugation, culminating in massacres and genocide. Despite all this, Armenians have clung fast to their Christian faith and have persevered. Their faith has been tested time and time again, but adversity has made it grow only stronger. And through it all, the Armenian nation has continually thanked God for our hope of life and an inheritance in heaven, given to us by the resurrection of his Son.

We all have ups and downs in our lives. We all encounter times of trial that are difficult to get through and that test our faith. We need to remember what the Levontian priests knew and what Armenians have felt through the centuries. Facing difficult times is not a reason to give up on our faith. It's an opportunity to allow our faith to grow stronger, to take comfort in the promises God has given us, and to feel the inexpressible inner joy of living, not as the world proposes, but as God wants.



DAY OF CELEBRATION AT NEW CAMPUS OF ST. NERSESS SEMINARY

On November 12, 2016, over 30 members from Holy Trinity attended a historic event – the official opening and consecration of St. Hagop Chapel at St. Nersess Armenian Seminary in Armonk, NY. The service was officiated by His Holiness Karekin II, Supreme Patriarch and Catholicos of All Armenians, assisted by His Eminence Archbishop Khajag

Barsamian, Primate of the Eastern Diocese and His Eminence Archbishop Hovnan Derderian, Primate of the Western Diocese.

The day began with a campus blessing where each building in St. Nersess was individually blessed and the official ribbon cutting upon His Holiness' arrival. His Holiness then consecrated the Chapel and the program began with a video tribute and a message by His Holiness.

In his message, His Holiness stated that St. Nersess "was founded to prepare a generation of clergy, so that their service would keep the spiritual and national identity of our people firm in the diversity of life in these United States, so that the light of faith, love and faithfulness to our culture and sacred values would remain unquenchable in the souls of the Armenian children."



Parishioners from Holy Trinity enjoyed the reception and mingled with other members of the Armenian Church, recalling their own personal experiences with the seminary. Very Rev. Fr. Daniel Findikyan recalled, "The first time I entered into St. Nersess Seminary I was 15 years old and didn't have any clue about the seminary. Later, it became my home where I got a Christian education and also decided to become a Clergyman and serve my Church,"

Der Hakob added that "the day was very inspiring and uplifting. The official opening and consecration of St. Nersess Seminary was a great success. It is the only Armenian Seminary in North America which not only prepares new priests for the Armenian Church but also educates our youth with Christian values. The Seminary will help many to learn God's Word and enlighten others."

Interesting Facts About St. Nersess Seminary:

- St. Nersess Armenian Seminary was established in 1961 through the vision of Archbiship Tiran Nersoyan of blessed memory.
- First located in Evanston, Illinois, it then relocated to New Rochelle, New York, and is now in Armonk, New York.
- Since its inception, three bishops, 37 priests and six lay ministers have graduated from St. Nersess and are in full-time service to the Armenian Church today.
- St. Nersess also has a strong youth outreach program. It is estimated that more than 6,000 young people have benefited spiritually and culturally from the summer conferences that started in 1963.



Good work, excellent leadership, and loving devotion is exhibited by the staffs working at all FAR initiatives. Their programs fall into six categories:



- 1. Economic Development: (1) The Gyumri Information Technology Center (GTech); (2) Breaking the Cycle of Poverty Program (BCPP).
- 2. Child Protection: (1) The FAR Children's Center; (2) Children of Armenia Sponsorship Program (CASP).
- 3. Healthcare Programs: (1) Continuing Medical Education (CME) Program; (2) Childhood malnutrition targeted through Breaking the Cycle of Poverty: Developing Thriving Communities (BCPP).
- 4. Education: (1) The Armenian National Science and Education Fund (ANSEF); (2) FAR's scholarship program; (3) The school rehabilitation project.
- 5. Social Services: (1) The Vanadzor Old Age Home (VOAH); (2) Soup kitchens.
- 6. AYO! raises funds for local development projects exclusively proposed by Armenians for Armenians.
