#### THE BEATITUDES

God blessed me, and our parishioners, with the opportunity to visit the Mount of Beatitudes twice in the last five years. And in that place we read brilliant words that Jesus taught to his disciples. Each verse has a lot to teach us and open our eyes.

#### "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." (Matthew 5:3)

It means we have to be humble in our spirits and should never be prideful. And we must think about our spiritual emptiness. Abraham is a great example of being poor in spirit, "Behold, I have taken upon myself to speak to the Lord, I who am but dust and ashes." (Genesis 18:27)

#### "Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy." (Matthew 5:7)

Our hope is that on the Last Judgment, God will judge us with mercy and not with justice. If we anticipate God's mercy, then we have to be merciful to those who sin against us.

## "Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God." (Matthew 5:8)

The heart is what we are and only God knows our heart. All good and bad deeds in our life come from the heart. Jesus came into this world so that we sinners can change our hearts.

## "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God." (Matthew 5:9)

Jesus sacrificed His life to make peace between God and us, and when we carry that message of peace to others, we are peacemakers. Also, peacemakers are those who try, with God's help, to

fix broken relationships and minimize the hatred in this world.



"Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." (Matthew 5:10) During His ministry Jesus taught mankind righteousness, and He said that the life of His followers is not going to be easy, "You will be hated by everyone because of Me, but the one who stands firm to the end will be saved." (Matthew 10:22)

"Blessed are you when people revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on My account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for in the same way, they persecuted the prophets who were before you." (Matthew 5:11)

To be Christian in this world means to walk the path of Calvary. I hope this little spiritual map can help us during our temporary journey on this earth.

#### PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Welcome back Sunday School and everyone else from the summer months. The dome looks terrific. Thanks so much to everyone who helped move a pew or two or otherwise coordinated the logistics. Michael Santerian, good for you. Larry Der Hagopian, good for you. Gary Altoonian, thank you for stepping in last minute. Others who helped, I don't know who you are and that is likely because that is the way you want it; you want to volunteer and go home. Good for you.

We have recently started to publish the plate collection numbers for each week along with our weekly expenses. Please remember that our weekly expenses average \$6,000 without any unusual expenditures for an elevator, a dome painting, fencing, or a boiler. A boiler. We are having our boiler repaired. Likely cost is \$10,000.

Give what you can, when you can. Please remember that we rely on contributions and stewardship for our operations. Relying on what we have accumulated to pay our existing expenses is us saying, let's pay our expenses today with yesterday's money and worry about the future some other day. We need today's money.



In that vein, look at what has happened with our leadership. "Father Haigazoun's children," as I call them, are all grown up, have children of their own and are taking significant roles in the leadership of our Church organizations, including Parish Council. Larry Der Hagopian is Vice Chairman, Nick Terkanian is on Parish Council and a Board Member at the Ararat Center, Michael Santerian is on Parish Council and runs the PAND organization and Antranig Garibian is a Member of the Diocesan Council. I could go on and on as there are many others who serve the Church in the Choir and on the Altar. It means you aren't kids any more, but it also reflects how strong an impact a leader can have on the present and future of an organization.

Those younger leaders might think to adopt that same style with their children and their friends' children, get them integrated into the Church as another home and continue the process of securing leadership for generations to come. If I can offer one bit of experience...don't change everything right away. When you go into a new role, you are full of ideas about how things can be done better, more efficiently, you're smarter than the old people. We are not smarter than the old people. Let yourself get into the role, listen and watch what takes place, evaluate the profitability or the prudence of the effort and gradually adjust what is being done to what you might think should be done. We owe that level of responsible governance to the Parish.

#### HOLY TRINITY CHURCH SCHOOL NEWS

#### **Christian Education**

The Holy Trinity Church School welcomed their students back on Sunday September 9th. After parents registered their children for the Armenian Language and Religion classes, parents and students had refreshments and met with their teachers. Then everyone went up to church where Der Hayr performed a special commitment service for our teachers, students, parents and congregation.

The service asks each group - teachers, parents, students and our congregation - to be aware of our responsibilities as a community to help our students grow in faith; to commit ourselves anyway we can; and to help make this school year successful.

We live in a society where parents and children are on the go all week. There are only so many hours in a week and coming to Church School on Sunday may not fit into our young parents' schedules. The Church School staff, and actually parishes all over the Diocese, are all in the same "boat." So how do we address the spiritual needs of our Armenian youth and make our program compelling to attend?

Yet here at Holy Trinity last school year, we had 100 students enrolled in our program! Our average attendance was around 50 each week. The student population was made up of students who had been coming to Holy Trinity for years and new students who were experiencing Church School for the first time. The staff quickly realized that it was time to rethink our program for this coming school year.

#### We are going "Back to Basics."

This year, as a pilot program, we have decided on a new approach to our school year.

- 1. There will be two semesters Fall and Spring
- 2. We will still be using the Diocesan-mandated curriculum We Believe but only the Worship/Prayer and Bible sections of the curriculum.
- 3. During the month of January parents and students are encouraged to attend Badarak together. Der Hayr will have special sermons and learning experiences for all.
- 4. February will be an enrichment month for grades 2 and above. Details to follow. Younger grades will have classes as usual
- 5. The Spring semester will begin on March 3, 2019. (Poon Paregentan)
- 6. May 19th is graduation and the last day of classes.

#### A Reflection by Deacon Albert Keshgegian:

We were made by the power of love. And our lives were meant — and are meant—to be lived in that love. That's why we're here. Ultimately, the source of love is God himself: the source of all our lives. -- Bishop Michael Bruce Curry, May 19, 2018

Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. God's love was revealed in this way: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God lives in us, and his love is perfected in us. (1 John 4:7-12)

It was the wedding of the decade, maybe the century. Prince Harry, the world's "most eligible bachelor", and Meghan Markle, American actress, were tying the knot. The world was watching, and all eyes were on the glamorous designer wedding dress, the pomp and ceremony.

But it was the sermon by Bishop Michael Bruce Curry from Chicago, the first African-American presiding bishop of the American Episcopal Church, who stole the show.

He spoke of love as the force or power that made us, and that our lives were meant to be lived in that power of love. That explains why we are here and what the purpose of our lives should be.

He went on to explain, quoting from the First Letter of John, that God is love (4:8b). Love is from God, and everyone who loves is born of God and knows God (4:7b). And we need to love one another, because if we do, God lives in us and his love is perfected in us (4:12b). We are living our lives the way God wants us to.

There's power in love. There's power in love to help and heal when nothing else can. There's power in love to lift up and liberate when nothing else will. There's power in love to show us the way to live.

Love created the world and us, and there's power in love, but love is not the way of the world. There's anger and hatred, envy and selfishness, war and evil. Bishop Curry quoted Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. to ask us to,

...discover the power of love, the redemptive power of love. And when we do that, we will make of this old world a new world, for love is the only way.

Bishop Curry went on, asking us to,

Think and imagine a world where love is the way. Imagine our homes and families where love is the way. Imagine neighborhoods and communities where love is the way. Imagine governments and nations where love is the way. Imagine business and commerce where this love is the way. Imagine this tired old world where love is the way. When love is the way – unselfish, sacrificial, redemptive.

When love is the way, then no child will go to bed hungry in this world ever again. When love is the way, we will let justice roll down like a mighty stream and righteousness like an ever-flowing brook. When love is the way, poverty will become history. When love is the way, the earth will be a sanctuary. When love is the way, we will lay down our swords and shields, down by the riverside, to study war no more. When love is the way, there's plenty good room – plenty good room – for all of God's children.

Because when love is the way, we actually treat each other, well...like we are actually family. When love is the way, we know that God is the source of us all, and we are brothers and sisters, children of God. My brothers and sisters, that's a new heaven, a new earth, a new world, a new human family.

Imagine that! We can change the world with the power of love that lies with us and within us. The same power that created us – God's love. And what a wonderful world that would be!

#### "Be Not Afraid"

"Be not afraid." Fear is common to all of us, but with God, we have hope. On the Feast of the Assumption, August 12, 2018, I explored this idea at Fellowship through a presentation on my experiences during the Young Adult Leadership Pilgrimage to the Holy Land this past June.

The trip was co-sponsored by the Diocese and individual parishes. I would like to express thanks to Diocesan benefactor Mr. Aso Tavitian, our beloved former primate Khajag Srpazan, our beloved current primate Hayr Taniel, Shake' Derderian and Nour Travels, and of course, my Holy Trinity family for making the trip a reality.

Alongside 21 other young adults, Der Vasken Kouzouian of "another" Holy Trinity (Cambridge, MA), and young adult Diocesan leaders Arpi Nakashian and Armen Terjimanian, I traveled in and around Jerusalem, including the Old City and the Armenian Quarter, Nazareth, Bethlehem, Jericho, Cana and Galilee. As we visited holy sites, celebrated Badarak and other liturgical services, and had Bible studies, a common theme emerged: Be not afraid.

At the Basilica of the Annunciation in Nazareth, my fellow pilgrims and I recalled when the Angel Gabriel appeared to Asdvadzadzin, St. Mary the Mother of God. Mary was afraid, but the angel said "be not afraid, you have found favor with God." The basilica houses many diverse icons of St. Mary, including one by a U.S. artist, Charles L. Madden, a "neighbor" in nearby Maple Glen, PA. His unusual icon, "Woman Clothed with the Sun," is made out of materials from the Apollo shuttle!

The Church of the Nativity in Bethlehem reminded all of us of another passage: near the time of Jesus' birth, when the Angel told shepherds "Be not afraid." The holy site of Jesus' birth is partially in custody of the Armenian Church, and we have the privilege of holding services there regularly. Der Vasken led the group in celebrating Badarak in the very cave where Jesus was born.

As a mini-retreat within the pilgrimage, our group spent a weekend in Galilee, where we ventured into the famous Sea of Galilee both from shore and by boat. Jesus spoke to His disciples out on this lake, saying "Be not afraid" when a storm arose and the disciples hadn't trusted Him to save them. How many times have we been through storms, and shouted at God to help us, only to realize that He had been there with us all along?

Of course, we all have a common, if not universal, fear: death. Scripture and the traditions of our church, like the Hokehankeesd prayers for those who are asleep, give us hope. We visited three holy sites that show God's power over death: Lazarus' tomb, where Jesus raised His friend from the dead; the church dedicated to the Assumption of St. Mary after she died; and of course, the highlight of many Jerusalem trips, the Church of the Holy Sepulcher where Jesus' empty tomb is seen. Once again, Der Vasken led the group in celebrating Badarak, while I had the privilege of singing the appropriate choir hymns, It was awesome to see Communion being prepared right on the traditional spot where Jesus' body lay!

The Armenian Badarak is celebrated there at 4:00 AM! But it is worth being there in the middle of the night for the depth and beauty of the celebration.

Finally, we are in exciting, but changing, times in our Church here in the U.S. and politically in Armenia. With new leadership, change is inevitable, and it is normal to feel afraid. But we can trust our God, the one who was born to St. Mary in Bethlehem, who calmed the storm in Galilee, and who conquers death, when he says to us, "Be not afraid."

#### **EXPLORING SHNORHALI AND SCRIPTURE**

For three Tuesday mornings in July, 14 of our parishioners and friends gathered at Holy Trinity to explore the writings of one of the most beloved saints of the Armenian Church—St. Nersess Shnorhali. The sessions were led by Fr. Hakob and senior Deacon Albert Keshgegian, who designed the series using excerpts from two of his books, "Beside Still Waters" and "My Lenten Journal."

The group examined selected prayers from Shnorhali's "I Confess with Faith" and from his lesser-known work, "Jesus, Son." All the selections were accompanied by Scripture passages illustrating the strong influence and inspiration Shnorhali received from the Holy Scriptures.

Discussion questions focused on St. Nersess' prayers and passages from both the Old and New Testaments. Many in the group noted the similarities in the texts. Participants were asked to reflect and share their reactions to the writings and how they could impact their personal faith and spirituality.

One of the participants commented, "I am familiar with the 24 prayers which we read during the Lenten season, but I had never heard of Jesus, Son. I was very moved by the prayers which spoke to me personally. The series has motivated me to look further into the writings of our Church Fathers." Another attendee stated, "Deacon Albert made the writing of St. Nersess Shnorhali accessible to people like me who have

little or no knowledge of Armenian and did a great job of putting it in the context of the Gospels."

Statements like those above are why the Adult Christian Education (ACE) team endeavors to develop programs such as this, which enable people to gain more insight into how the writings of our church fathers and Holy Scripture are interwoven, all with the goal of personal spiritual growth.

#### SUMMER HOME BIBLE STUDIES

For the third consecutive year, our parish took its adult Christian education ministry into parishioners' neighborhoods. To reach out to parishioners who have been unable to participate in educational programs at Church, due to work commitments and/or travel distance. Three parishioner families once again graciously offered to host Bible Studies in their homes located in geographical regions more accessible to many Holy Trinity families.

On three consecutive Wednesday evenings in June, the faithful gathered at the homes of Jeanette Der Hagopian, Deacon Albert and Patrice Keshgegian, and Margo and Sam Silk to talk about passages from the Gospels. The discussions were facilitated by lay parishioners, Gail Lulejian, senior deacon Albert Keshgegian, and Nadia Soghomonian, with Pastor Fr. Hakob Gevorgyan in attendance. The evenings were concluded with food and fellowship.

Topics included the Parable of the Unforgiving Servant, the Miracle of the Raising of Lazarus, and Jesus and the Miraculous Catch of Fish.

When asked to describe their experience, participants responded with the following words: informative, wonderful, lively discussions. And everyone thanked the hosts for their warm hospitality.

This donation enabled us to pay for the painting of the hall two years ago and to cover the expense of the dome renovation. Their generosity is deeply appreciated.

#### In Memoriam: Robert A. Hanamirian

Re-printed from the Philadelphia Inquirer:

Robert A. Hanamirian, 80, of Fort Washington and New York City, who was the son of Armenian immigrants and rose to become an international tax lawyer, died Monday, June 25, of natural causes at his New York home.

From 2001 until 2018, Mr. Hanamirian was a tax lawyer with the firm of Kranjac Tripodi & Partners LLP on Wall Street. For the last five years, he had also been of counsel at the Moorestown law firm run by his son, John M. Hanamirian. From 1995 to 2001, Mr. Hanamirian operated a solo law firm from his Fort Washington home.

A first-generation Armenian American, Mr. Hanamirian was born in Philadelphia to Mooshegh and Hratcha Hanamirian, who fled the Ottoman Empire in 1915 in response to the slaughter of Armenian citizens by Turks. The Armenian Genocide resulted in the deaths of 1.5 million Armenians in what is now Turkey.

His parents lived in China before reaching the United States in 1920. Once in Philadelphia, they became the proprietors of the York Market, a general store in Chestnut Hill. They owned and operated a Middle Eastern frozen foods company elsewhere in Philadelphia.

Initially, Mr. Hanamirian spoke only Armenian. He graduated from Cheltenham High School, where he played football. He graduated from Temple University and Temple's Beasley School of Law, and later completed a master of taxation degree at New York University School of Law.

Although first in his law-school class, Mr. Hanamirian encountered ethnic bias when he applied for work at some of the "white shoe" Philadelphia law firms, his family said. He responded by emphasizing the paralegal work he had done in law school, and was soon hired as an associate lawyer by the Philadelphia law firm of

Schnader Harrison Segal & Lewis LLP. He worked for Schnader for 11 years, and for other Philadelphia law firms and in solo practice, before joining Kranjac Tripodi. "He was known for international tax strategy and planning," his son said. "He liked the esoteric nature of the different [countries'] laws and treaties, and enjoyed that intellect challenge."


In 1960, Mr. Hanamirian married Pauline Kash. The couple had two children whom they raised in Fort Washington. The couple divorced in 1980. Pauline Chapjian, as she became after remarrying, survives. In 1983, he married Sharon M. Hanamirian, who also survives.

Like his father, John M. Hanamirian became a lawyer. Mr. Hanamirian's daughter, Deborah Nareen Hanamirian, had multiple sclerosis. She lived at Inglis House, where the family visited frequently. She died in 2016 at age 54.

"They were very much alike," Mr. Hanamirian's son said of his father and sister. "She was very strong-minded. They were not people who let things defeat them. They were really kindred spirits."

Mr. Hanamirian loved animals, especially his German shepherd, Toby.

In addition to his son and former wife, Mr. Hanamirian is survived by two granddaughters and a sister.
