

How to Make Right Decisions

I am sure that every person wants to make a right decision.

During their lifetime, people have to make many different decisions, for example: which school to attend, whom to get married, where to work, what kind of house to buy, with whom to be a friend, where to go to church, what religion to practice and the list can go on and on.

Some decisions are not important. For example, if we drink apple juice instead of orange juice it's not going to affect our lives that much. But for important things, we want to make the right decision because we are going to face the consequences of our decisions. Many people have ruined their lives or ended them because they made a bad decision. People make a lot of bad decisions because they don't know where they want to go in life.

Jesus knew what His purpose was for being here, "For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save that which was lost" (Luke 19:10). He made it clear that he did not come to solve a political issue but something more important: He came for sinners or for those who were spiritually sick.

Our decisions are based on what is more important for us. If our earthly life is the only life that we are going to live, then we will concentrate on this life only. But if we believe that there is a heavenly life and God put us here for a purpose, then we will make our decisions according to His will.

What is our purpose here on earth? If we consider ourselves as followers of Christ, then we should be the salt and the light of this world. "You are the salt of the earth. But if the salt loses its saltiness, how can it be made salty again? It is no longer good for anything, except to be thrown out and trampled underfoot. You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven" (Matthew 5:13-16).

What should we do when we have to make an important decision? The Bible says, "Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you" (Matthew 7:7). This tells us that we should look for the answer in God's word, the Bible and we should ask God in prayer, knock and wait for God to open that door.

Parish Council News

We didn't have a column in the last issue. I started to write about charging for Sunday School and there was debate about raising the issue because it challenges the notion that Christian Education should be available at no cost. Our Parish Council was divided on the issue. We decided to defer the issue for a year.

I didn't like not writing about the Sunday School issue because I felt as if we were suppressing information or speech. I said at the time that my Sunday School teachers, and maybe it was Marta and I apologize if it isn't perceived by her as credit, said that "God listens to all voices." We need to listen to all voices on the issues that affect our Parish whether we like the sound of the voice or what a speaker has to say.

I agree that, ideally, Christian Education or Armenian Church School Education should be available to all at no cost and our Parish Council wants our children to have the benefits of Armenian Church School education in every form. The Parish Council was proposing to reinstate the fees only for the cost of materials and only charging that fee to non-members; there would be no fee for members. That fee was \$25.00, representing the costs of paper and markers and other supplies for the year. The dialogue at Parish Council was more about encouraging, obtaining and retaining members than it was about the financial aspects of charging for Church School. The discussion centered on whether charging, having people economically invested, would actually make it more likely that the parents would bring their children to Church School.

I think you know how I feel. Just pay the membership dues and let's start there. If you can't, we will waive them. If you send your children to use the programs or if you eat the choreg and cheese and drink the coffee, pay something for it. Somebody came to Church and made the choreg for you. Somebody volunteered their Sunday morning to teach your child. Put five dollars in the basket for the food and give the Church School \$20.00 for the markers and paper for a year of education and for teaching your children for 3 hours on a Sunday for 20 weeks. Okay, I'm done.

Next, the Active Shooter Policy. This is something we have spent a great deal of time on and have taken very much to heart. It is about our children and our parishioners. Mickey, Michael, Larry and Arous have spent countless hours with the Township, with our security company and with other experts evaluating our existing security systems and evaluating the best ways to assure our overall safety in the event we have a situation with an active shooter. The unfortunate reality of that situation is that "run, hide, fight" is the protocol most advanced by all of the experts. We think that having armed guards and all sorts of sophisticated detection equipment is the answer, but the reality is that it is not and that these acts of terror are too unpredictable to avert by traditional means. So, we do our best, we implement our best security systems, we are aware of our surroundings and if you see something suspicious, and just as the highway signs as you are traveling into the New York City crossings, if you see something suspicious, report it. If you see someone sitting in their car in the parking lot whom you do not recognize, say something to someone. Be involved. Get involved. It is your church, your home.

Finally, we have done a lot this year. Gay did a terrific job on the Bazaar and had a lot of help from a lot of our usual and new volunteers. Thank you to all. Everything went incredibly well and it was just fun. Our Church School enrollment continues to grow. Thank you, Yn. Anna and Leslie for doing such a great job running the School. The children and parents are lucky to have you.



OUR KHACHKAR

If you missed the magnificent exhibit of Armenian Medieval Art last winter at the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York which brought together, among other things, beautifully illuminated manuscripts and giant stone crosses known as "khachkars," you may take comfort knowing that we, at Holy Trinity Armenian Church, have our very own khachkar adorning the front lawn of the church.

While ours is not several centuries old, its symbolism and spirit are akin to those towering stone slabs found in cemeteries and shrines throughout the Armenian uplands from earliest times in history.

They were erected mainly to remember and honor the dead, as well as for the spiritual salvation of living persons. Our granite khachkar with the traditional carvings of an Armenian cross, sprouting tendrils, grapevines and pomegranates was unveiled in 1996 during the tenure of Very Rev. Fr. Haigazoun Dz. Melkonian, of blessed memory, with an initial bequest from the estate of Paul Garabedian and the donations of more than 50 Holy Trinity Church families.

Our khachkar is dedicated to "the memory of the Armenians massacred during the Genocide of 1915." But, it is also intended to remind us not only of our tragic past, but to continue to uphold our Christian tradition into the future.

For the last several years, overgrown shrubs have partially hidden our khachkar, but thanks to the efforts of Father Hakob, assisted by Maggie Miller, all of its sides and its inscriptions are in full view, and new landscaping has been implemented. Everyone who comes to our church is invited to stop by the khachkar, take in its beauty and remember for what it stands.






