

WELL-FED SHEEP DON'T STRAY.

THE FEAST OF THE GLORIOUS RESURRECTION

The Feast of the Glorious Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ or the Easter Feast is one of the five major feasts of the Armenian Church. The main origin of the feast is the following.

Since the year 325, Easter has been observed on the first Sunday after the full moon following the vernal equinox (the time when the sun crosses the equator). Therefore, Easter always falls between March 22 and April 25. Early Christians observed Easter on the fourteenth day of Nisan (April) no matter what day of the week it fell on.

But, regardless of when it is observed, Easter is and will always be a special day for every believer. It is special because of what it represents historically, biblically, and spiritually. Following the crucifixion and death of Jesus Christ, His body was taken off the cross and placed into the tomb and the entrance of the tomb was closed by a large stone and the soldiers were ordered to guard it. After three days, the three women who had followed Jesus from Galilee, Mary



Magdalene, Mary, the Mother of James and Joseph, and the wife of Zebedee, brought spices and perfumes to anoint our Lord's Body. They found the stone rolled away, so they went in, but they didn't see the body. They stood there puzzled about this, when suddenly an angel dressed in white appeared to them and said, "Why are you looking among the dead for one who is alive?"

He is not here, He has been raised" (Luke 24:5-6). The women returned from the tomb and told all these things to the eleven disciples and the rest.

When we read the words of the apostles in Romans 4, 6 and 8. (Romans 4:25: "He was delivered over to death for our sins and was raised to life for our justification." Romans 6:4: "We were therefore buried with Him through baptism unto death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life." Romans 8:11: "And if the spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, He who raised Christ from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through His Spirit, who lives.") we find that the Easter message was the dominant theme of their preaching and witnessing.

It was the heart and soul of the message they shared and declared. In Acts 4:33 we read, "And with great power gave the apostles witness of the resurrection of the Lord Jesus." It is obvious, that to them, the meaning and message of Easter was special.

"He is not here. He is risen." That's a great truth. Easter is more than just an argument for life after death, one more statement of human survival. Easter is more than the demonstration of the power of God. It is not just our Lord



giving us a revelation, a religious show to demonstrate His power, even power over death. Easter is an argument for life after death, an undeniable argument, but it is much more. Easter is the definitive statement of the power of God.

Paul said that "If Christ has not been raised, our preaching is useless and so is your faith." (I Corinthians 15:14) But he goes on to declare, "But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep."(I Corinthians 15:20) What we believe about the resurrection of Christ determines our destiny. It determines our joy in this life, and it determines our hope of the life to come.

On the day of the Easter feast, people dye eggs red as a symbol of fruitful life, salvation and joy. St. Gregory of Datev considers the egg to be the symbol of the world, the shell of which is the sky, the membrane is the air, the white is the water and the yolk is the earth. Dyeing eggs red symbolizes the salvation of the world by means of the Blood of Christ.

The family is an intimate community of persons. Christian family life is a privileged locale for encountering God in everyday life.

In the faith development theories of the two giants in the field, John Westerhoff and James Fowler, most of today's Sunday school-age children are somewhere between "affiliative faith" and "searching faith" (Westerhoff's terms). This means that

Most Sunday school students still:

- 1. enjoy a sense of belonging and participating, e.g. in Sunday school, service projects, special activities, etc.
- 2. feel special to this particular religious community and are missed when not present.
- 3. experience religion through *feelings*, a religion of the heart not the head.
- 4. look to the authority of the community for the stories and lifestyles of faith.

but may also be starting to:

- 1. doubt and be critical of people and ideas in the church.
- 2. be interested in other traditions, considering them good alternatives.
- 3. champion other ideas, whimsically, in rapid succession.

How Parents Can Help

- 1. Be an *example* (the most difficult task of parenthood).
- 2. Be a regular part of church life, even if the most you can do is be present on Sundays.
- 3. Express how important *you* feel Sunday school is. Be sure you can articulate your feelings.
- 4. Make it clear that you also value learning about your faith and the story of your church.
- 5. Refer to God, pray, read from the Bible. Even the most modest gesture can indicate that the spiritual journey is real to you.
- 6. Do not dismiss doubts and criticisms. Remind them that the church is not perfect because it is made up of human beings but that perhaps underneath the mess we sometimes make of things or in the case of difficult doctrines (the Trinity, sin, etc.) there are important truths, like a treasure. E.g. if kids decide the Adam and Eve story is silly, tell them perhaps all that's important for them to know right now is that *God made the world and it is good*.
