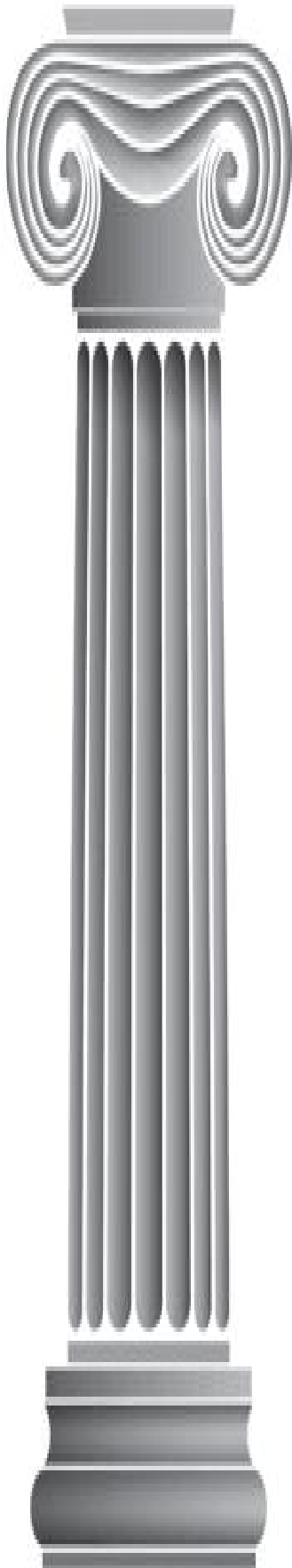

I'd like to take this opportunity to thank Merle Santerian, Bob Damerjian and Antranig Garibian for their six years on Council. Enjoy the break.

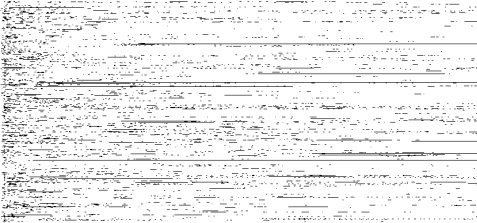

From Der Hakob

This is the beginning of a series on the Seven Sacraments of the Armenian Church

Baptism

*"Therefore go and make disciples of all nations,
baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and of the Holy Spirit"
Matthew 28:19*



Baptism is an important step of obedience for every person who has accepted Christ as their personal Savior. Through the example of Jesus Christ, the Bible demonstrates that Baptism is significant in the life of a believer. Jesus was baptized, setting an example for us to follow (Matt. 3:13-15). Baptism is the first step of faith for a Christian after receiving Jesus Christ as their personal Savior (Acts 2:41). It is important that each individual fully understand Baptism and its significance in their life.

The word Baptism comes from the Greek noun Baptisma which means ritual washing. Baptism is also called born again. In the Armenian Apostolic Church we have Seven Holy Sacraments. Baptism is the first sacrament one must receive before the other six. During this Sacrament we are cleansed from the Original Sin which we inherited from our forefather Adam who ate the forbidden fruit in Paradise.

Baptism is a very important condition in order to be a believer and to believe in the Holy Trinity: The Father, The Son and the Holy Spirit. "Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned" (Mark 16:16). This shows that Baptism is a guarantee for our salvation. Faith is very important for the person who is going to be baptized. If a person is not an adult, then his Godfather and parents should take care of his physical and spiritual needs.

In the Armenian Church there is no age restriction for the Baptism. Baptism is officiated by an ordained priest and by water. The officiating priest immerses the child into the water saying the following once: "The servant of God, coming from the state of Catechumen to Baptism, is now being baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Redeemed by the blood of Christ from the servitude of sin, he/she becomes an adopted child of the heavenly Father, a co-heir with Christ and a temple of the Holy Spirit."

There is no second Baptism in the Armenian Church, because the Gospel says "There is one Lord, one Faith, one Baptism" (Ephesians 4:5) or "Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death?" (Romans 6:3).

Baptism makes all of us (Christians) equal for God. "For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ. There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is no male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus" (Galatians 3:27-28).

As we see, Baptism is a very important sacrament for us believers, but as Christians we should nourish and increase our faith and do good deeds. In that way our Baptism will become more meaningful and significant.

SUNDAY SCHOOL CORNER

There is nothing more humbling than seeing the face of someone as their life is impacted with the simple gift of shoes."

MARTYRS' DAY

For the first time in our memory, this year was the first time that Easter and Martyrs' Day fell on the same day. On Saturday the annual Genocide Walk began in front of Meher's statue at the Art Museum and ended at the Independence Visitors Center with a moving message from well-known attorney, Mark Geragos, who previously settled a class-action lawsuit against New York Life Insurance Co. and AXA Corp. for withholding death benefits on policies purchased by Armenians prior to the Genocide.

The day after Easter, St. Gregory Illuminator was the host church for this year's Intercommunal Commemoration of the Genocide. Following *Badarak*, a Requiem Service was held outdoors at the *khatchkar*. After a lavish dessert buffet, a slide presentation was shown by Garo Garibian who detailed the path to having the first Divine Liturgy celebrated at the Church of Akhtamar in Turkey since the Genocide. This was only possible through the dedication and diligence of Ohannes Hashas who persisted in working with the Turkish government to make it happen. Although illness prevented Ohannes from being at this event, his grandsons, Michael and John, were in attendance and also shared the incredible pride and joy they felt at witnessing, with their grandfather, this monumental feat.

Surely this year, April 24th was a bittersweet day.....celebrating the Risen Christ and also remembering those millions who perished because of holding fast to their faith.

A Meditation

"Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me... Surely goodness and love will follow me all the days of my life, and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever."
Psalm 23:4a,6

We looked forward to it at the hospital every Friday. The oncologists (cancer doctors) and pathologists (lab doctors) conferenced over lunch about the interesting cases of the week. As we munched on sandwiches, chips, and cookies, or sometimes even hot food, we discussed the patient's history, reviewed the pathology slides, and discussed patient management with the oncology fellows. It was a very sociable, cordial atmosphere, and sometimes laughter would fill the room, despite the often serious cases that we were discussing.

On one of these Friday afternoons we were considering the case of a middle-aged man, an Episcopal priest, who had developed acute lymphoblastic leukemia (cancer of white blood cells). As the senior oncology attending physician went through chemotherapy approaches by quizzing the fellows, he mentioned that patients often don't realize how arduous the therapy can be. Many of the drugs we have available are, after all, poisons, which we hope will kill the cancer cells more than they kill normal cells. Every patient, he said, goes through a "valley", a time when the blood cell counts are so low from the chemotherapy that the patient is anemic and susceptible to life-threatening infections and bleeding.

As I sat there nibbling on my second cookie and sipping Diet Coke, my mind was suddenly transported from the medical realm to the spiritual. My thoughts went immediately to the 23rd Psalm. It speaks of "walking through the valley of the shadow of death", much like the valley produced by the medicines we use, which create the potential for serious injury and harm. "I will fear no evil" writes the psalmist speaking to God, for "you are with me". And at the end of the Psalm, looking forward, the psalmist feels the peace, tranquility, and hope that come from his faith, knowing that, whatever happens, "goodness and love" will be with him in this life, and dwelling with God in the next.

How appropriate, I thought, if these phrases would have been shared with the patient, especially since, as a priest, he had already devoted his life to service to God.

The conference conversation had quickly turned to the highly technical aspects of how to administer and schedule the chemotherapy options. But my thoughts were still with the patient as a person. Physicians are not charged just with titrating dosages and regimens of drugs until the desired laboratory values are achieved; they are charged with treating and making whole the entire

individual. To what extent should a physician tap into the religious faith of the patient to help them heal, in mind as well as in body?

The "valley" of chemotherapy isn't just about the low points of blood cell counts and the potential complications that could follow. For this patient, at this time, the "valley" could also be about his concerns and fears for his future, and how God could comfort and support him through what was to come. Isn't helping with this aspect of illness what medicine also is, or should be, all about?

And this doesn't apply just to doctors. Each of us has the ability to comfort, support, and help heal those who are ill, whether friends or family. We can help them go through their "valley of the shadow of death" and come to the promise that God loves them and is with them, always.
