Marriage

The Sacrament of Marriage is the fifth Sacrament of the Armenian Apostolic Church. It is the consecration of the union between man and woman. God Himself is the author of this Sacrament. Then God blessed them and said, "Be fruitful and multiply. Fill the earth and govern it. Reign over the fish in the sea, the birds in the sky, and all the animals that scurry along the ground" (Genesis 1:28).

In our Church this Sacrament can be performed by a Priest or Bishop. The couple comes to the Church and they make vows before God and before the people. Then the Priest unites their right hands and says a prayer. Then the Priest goes up to the Altar, and the couple walks up to the area below the Altar and the Priest places their foreheads together and prays for their unity. This act unites them with a spiritual bond to each other and to the Church. For this reason a man shall leave his

father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh. So then, they are no longer two but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, let not man separate" (Matt.19:5-6).

In his Letter to the Ephesians St. Paul gives very important advice to married couples and compares their unity to Christ and His Church. Wives, submit yourselves to your own husbands as you do to the Lord. For the husband is the head of the wife as Christ is the head of the church, his body, of which he is the Savior. Now as the church submits to Christ, so also wives should submit to their husbands in everything. Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her" (Eph 5:22-25). This is read at our Service of Holy Matrimony as the main lesson.

For the Sacrament of Holy Marriage couples should be adults and Baptized.

There must be no close blood relationship to each other. They should know the duties of married life and they should obey the marriage laws of the Church.


The main goal of Marriage is bringing children into this world but it also was established by God for the mutual love and support of man and woman "The LORD God said, "It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a helper suitable for him" (Gen 2:18).

The duties of marred couples are to be faithful to each other and to love, respect and honor one another. With mutual love and respect the family will be stable, safe and blessed.

Today some people give importance only to a Civil Marriage or they simply live together all of their life without the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony.

For a Christian couple it is important to receive the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony blessed by God rather then a Civil Ceremony.

- t Bible study has continued and will in the future


PILLAR V: EVENTS & TECHNOLOGY






Palm Sunday Banquet

2012 Lent Series



Church of Akhtamar in Turkey

On Sunday, March 11, 2012, the Knights and Daughters of Vartan presented a program at Holy Trinity Church with guest speaker Johnny Alexanian. After a delicious breakfast prepared by the Knights was served, Johnny spoke about his experience at the Church of AKHTAMAR in Turkey. The Church of the Holy Cross was once an important Armenian cathedral. The seat of the Armenian Orthodox patriarch, the cathedral was founded by King Gagik between 915 and 921 as part of a royal complex that included a palace, monastery, streets, gardens and terraced parks. The church is all that remains today. The church was designed by the Armenian architect Trdat Mendet (also known as Manuel). The Church of the Holy Cross was the seat of an Armenian patriarch from 1116 to 1895, after which it was abandoned due to conflict between Armenia and the Ottoman Empire. The building fell into disrepair and was neglected throughout the 20th century.

Ohannes Hashas, a member of Holy Trinity Armenian Church, had a dream to have a cross placed on top of the church once again. Mr. Hashas went to Van, a couple of years ago to start the necessary process to have a cross back on the church. He met with many Turkish political leaders, including the governor of Van, and also the Police Commissioner of Istanbul, Turkey. Mr. Hashas was granted special permission to go to the island of Akhtamar and visit the Church of The Holy Cross. For the past two years, Mr. Hashas had been trying to prove that the cross is necessary for the church. Not only is it a significant symbol to the Armenian people and church, but it will also provide a sense of peace between the Armenians and the Turks. After two years of debates, Mr. Hashas was given the okay to have the cross placed on top of both domes at the Church of The Holy Cross. He was so thrilled that he donated one of the crosses to the church. Finally, the Cross was installed on the top (main) dome on October 1, 2010.

On September 18, 2010, Mr. Hashas arrived at the airport in Van, along with his two grandchildren, Johnny & Michael Alexanian, and Dr. Garo Garibian. On September 19, 2010, Mr. Ohannes Hashas was able to experience and participate in the Badarak on the island of Akhtamar in Van, Turkey with his two grandchildren, Johnny and Michael. The last time Badarak was performed there was before the Armenian Genocide in the early 1900's.

Johnny Alexanian concluded his presentation by sharing that "experiencing the Badarak in person brought tears to my eyes, not just because I was witnessing a historic event, but also because it was an event that had taken place on my birthday."




Armenian School Hantes.

A Meditation on the Divine Liturgy

And we offer to you yours of your own from all and for all. Yev uzkooys ee koyots kez madootsanemk usd amenaynee yev haghaks amenetsoon.

These words are chanted by the priest during the Divine Liturgy between the hymns Hayr Yergnavor (Hymn to the Father) and Hamenaynee (In all things blessed are you, O Lord). They are part of the long Eucharistic Prayer that the priest offers on our behalf, mostly said silently during hymns, but some parts, such as the above, audibly chanted. The words above come as we offer our sacrifice of bread and wine to God, after we have remembered the words of Christ at the Last Supper and before God sends the Holy Spirit to transform our gifts of bread and wine into the very body and blood of Christ.


What is the significance of these words? We might ask if there is any material object we can offer to God that doesn't already belong to him. Bread? Wine? God created the sun that provides light energy for the wheat and grapes to grow. God created the soil that anchors the wheat stalk and grapevine. God created the water and nutrients in the soil that help the plants grow. We might argue, though, that it was human ingenuity that figured out how to make bread from wheat and wine from grapes. But God also created humans, giving us our abilities, intelligence and ingenuity, as well as everything else

We often pride ourselves on abilities that we have that are better than those of other people. We may be able to add a column of figures better than anyone else, even doing the whole thing in our head without a calculator. We may have created a mouth-watering, award winning recipe for chocolate cake. We may be able to swim the 100 meter breast stroke better than anyone else in the world in the Olympics. But all of these abilities come from God. He made the first man out of dust, and the first woman from the rib of the first man. Dust and a rib -- that's all we are or we can ever be without him. All of creation, all that exists, including every part of us, belongs to him. Everything that is good is a gift from God (James 1:17).

And so, whatever we offer to God, such as an animal sacrifice or bread and wine, already belongs to him. We are offering him what is already "of his own". (And what we do offer, we do humbly, as indicated in the directions to the priest to lift up the gifts only partially as he says the words of the prayer.) The only thing that we can offer God, which he does not already have, is ourselves: our love in return for his love, our dedication to him and to doing his works. And this we do during the Divine Liturgy, in parallel and invisibly, along with the visible offering of the bread and wine. God gives us a choice, just as Adam and Eve had a choice. We have free will. We can turn away from him or choose to follow him.

And we make our offering on behalf of all who are followers of Christ—whether they are with us among the congregation, whether they are ill at home or in the hospital, whether they are members of Christ's Church in a far-off city, whether they are alive or asleep in Christ.

How often do we thank God for all the wonderful gifts he has bestowed, and continues to bestow, on us? How often do we thank him for our personal successes? Could it ever be often enough?

BURIAL SITES AVAILABLE

The church currently has available two burial sites in the Armenian Section of the Whitemarsh Memorial Park, located in Chalfont, Pennsylvania. The church had four sites donated in 2004 by a former parishioner, two of which have since been sold to current parishioners.

The remaining two sites are "double" which means the burial caskets are placed on top of each other, rather than side by side. The cost is \$1,500 for the "double" site. A transfer fee of \$145 is paid by the church. Whitemarsh Memorial Park is approximately 12 miles from Holy Trinity Armenian Church. A number of our former parishioners are currently buried in the Armenian Section. Whitemarsh does not allow grave stones, only ground plates for marking burial sites. ===>*****


Parishioners interested in purchasing one of the remaining two "double" sites should contact the church office.



The ACEF with a book value of \$203,586 has generated income of \$8,900.62 with money appropriated to Choir, ACYOA's, Sunday School and to income per our approved budget.

The two George Ananian Endowment funds and the one from Vera Kazigian are managed by our Investment Committee. This has generated \$22,744 so far which has been re-invested since our income was slightly positive last year. However, the income that this will generate is included in our 2012 Budgeted Income which was approved at the Parish Assembly in February.

Our goal is to increase this number dramatically in order to generate more income and let our hard working parishioners relax a little.

Representing the Republic of Armenia were Foreign Minister Edward Nalbandian, Minister of Diaspora Hranush Hakobyan, and His Excellency Tatoul Markarian, Armenia's Ambassador to the United States.

James Kalustian, a member of the Diocesan Council and President of the Armenian Heritage Foundation, introduced Massachusetts Governor Deval Patrick, who offered remarks. Other speakers included U.S. Representative Edward Markey and Boston Mayor Thomas Menino. Middlesex Sheriff Peter Koutoujian was the master of ceremonies.

The park features an abstract sculpture commemorating the immigrant experience and the Armenian Genocide, as well as a labyrinth of grass and stone symbolizing life's journey. His Holiness Karekin II, the Supreme Patriarch and Catholicos of All Armenians, presided over a groundbreaking ceremony for the park in September 2010.
