

### **HOLY COMMUNION**

Holy Communion is the most important Sacrament of the Christian Church. Through this Sacrament we receive the Body and the Blood of Jesus Christ, in the form of consecrated Bread and Wine. The Sacrament of Holy Communion was established by our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. "Now as they were eating, Jesus took Bread, and after blessing it, broke it and gave it to the disciples, and said, "Take, eat; this is my Body." And He took the cup, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying, "Drink of it, all of you, for this is my Blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins." (Matthew 26:26-28)



Holy Communion has several names:

- a) Eucharist
- b) The Lord's Supper
- c) Communion
- d) Holy Sacrifice or Sourp Badarak

Let's see what Holy Communion means for us. For a believer Holy Communion means the Body and the Blood of our Savior; but for the unbeliever it means just bread and wine. Our Church fathers were very clear in teaching that the Consecrated Elements of the Holy Communion are the very Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. St. Cyril of Jerusalem said, "That which seems bread is not bread, even if it is so perceived by the taste, but is the Body of Christ." How should we prepare to receive Holy Communion? First of all, a person must be baptized. An adult person should acknowledge his sins, confess and repent. Before taking Communion we should fast and pray from Saturday evening or Sunday morning.

We should take the Sacrament of Holy Communion very seriously, because St. Paul warns all Christians, "So then, whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the Body and Blood of the Lord. Everyone ought to examine themselves before they eat of the bread and drink from the cup. For those who eat and drink without discerning the Body of Christ eat and drink judgment on themselves. That is why many among you are weak and sick, and a number of you have fallen asleep. But if we were more

discerning with regard to ourselves, we would not come under such judgment." (1 Corinthians 11: 27-31)

When can we take Holy Communion? In the First Century, Christians celebrated the Lord's Supper every day. The Armenian Church did the same in the past. But in the Catholic Church they still celebrate Eucharist every day. Today we celebrate Holy Badark only on Saturdays, Sundays and if there is a special feast day during the week.

Armenian Christians can take Holy Communion whenever they think they are ready or at least five times a year, during the five major feast days, which are The Nativity and Theophany of our Lord, Easter, The Transfiguration of our Lord, Assumption of the Holy Mother-of-God, and The Exaltation of Holy Cross.

Dear faithful, let us use this period of Great Lent in preparation for the Glorious Resurrection of our Lord, and for Holy Communion, which is medicine for our sins.

### **CHAIRMAN'S REPORT**

It was a successful year for our parish from a growth and activity standpoint. All churchgoers could see the increase in attendance, altar servers and choir members. Our youth groups, Sunday school activity and voting membership also increased showing growth as well. Financially, our Operating Income for normal operations exceeded expenses by \$4,600. Additional monies, mostly from the PAND donation early last year, were spent for pew cushions, new hall roof, Sunday school refurbishment, ACYOA Srs Sports weekend, Armenian Habitat and Armenian camp. We will start a series in The LOOYS with a series in this issue explaining where the money comes from and where it goes as we did at the Assembly. We will also begin reporting on the Endowments that were generously donated by past parishioners.



We spent almost a year negotiating with SPECTRA Energy for the location and payment amounts for the easement and quickly received approval from the Diocesan Council and Board of Trustees to proceed. My thanks to them for having faith in us.

One of our crowning achievements was the Ordination of nine Acolytes and Sub- Deacons and you can see them participating in Badarak. Some of our major expenditures will be for a new copier (done), repair of the dome to eliminate a major new leak during Noreasters, and replacing all the concrete on the front steps and landing of the Church. We will also continue the partial scholarships for Armenian camp attendees.

Lay Ministry, a theme of the Diocese, was presented to the Parish Council and the group discussion was led by Nancy Basmajian. This gave each of us insight into how we see the Church; how we see our roles in its operation; the different viewpoints we all had; and the need for many lay people to devote their time and talent to make the Church successful.

Every week we see new attendees at Badarak. It is imperative that we take the time to welcome them to our parish. This was a nicety given to me from the church in Niagara Falls many years ago when I was working in Buffalo.

The Parish Assembly went very smoothly and I'd like to thank all of the participants for their work. All items presented were approved without dissent. The vote for approval of the Easement was approved unanimously. The income will go to investments to generate future income. There are two motions that we will present at the Diocesan Assembly.



Our thanks to Dr, Garo Garibian for the years he served on the Council and a warm welcome to Steve Hovnanian who was elected to serve. We will have elections within the Parish Council in late March.

I believe all of you can feel the positive can-do attitude at our affairs, our organizations and our fellowship hour, thanks to Der Hakob and all of you. We expect that we will continue our upward path in all directions this year and beyond.

### **Greg Bilazarian**

On January 8, the Holy Trinity ACYOA Seniors hosted a presentation by Greg Bilazarian, a Church parishioner and current employee of the Yerevan-based organization called The Civilitas Foundation. Bilazarian, 27, participated in Birthright Armenia in the summer of 2011 after taking a sabbatical from his full-time employment as a news reporter. During his stint in Armenia, he was offered – and accepted – a full time job with Civilitas working on a new media project. The Civilitas Foundation, founded by Armenia's former Minister of Foreign Affairs Vartan Oskanian, is an Armenian non-profit organization which aims to strengthen civil society, promote democracy, economic development and education in Armenia. It also aims to facilitate dialogue between Armenia and the international community on a number of pertinent political issues. This past September, Bilzaraian helped launch CivilNet.tv which uses the Internet and media to better understand the general feeling of the citizens of Armenia.

During his presentation, Bilazarian posed the audience a question and had everyone work together to find possible solutions: "how can we get Armenians to stay in Armenia?" He explained that many Armenians in the diaspora visit Armenia but fail to stay; while many native Armenians are leaving their homeland to seek better employment opportunities. Bilazarian hypothesized that the nation of Armenia will not continue to be an independent nation if the population trend continues this way.

A major problem in Armenia is the unavailability of decent employment, suitable enough for wage-earners to live a comfortable lifestyle. Bilazarian debunked the myth that everything is cheaper in Armenia by explaining that essential items are relatively comparable to pricing in the United States.

Two zones of employment hope for Armenia, Bilazarian explained, are information technology and tourism – both of which can be remarkable opportunities for the country if leveraged appropriately. There is a focus on technology among the



youth in Armenia which can prepare them for competitive and dynamic careers.

Overall, Bilazarian is very optimistic yet realistic about Armenia's future. He believes that Armenia can thrive if enough can be done to maintain the population of natives and the diaspora. If Bilazarian's motivational presentation and his personal commitment inspired just one person, it is a step in the right direction for the future of our motherland!

### Oriental Orthodox Regional Youth Conference:

Holy Trinity participated in the Oriental Orthodox Regional Youth Conference at St. Anthony Coptic Orthodox Church in Medford, NJ. Members representing the Oriental Orthodox faith gathered in fellowship and study as they continue to embrace outward togetherness.

**Lenten Dinner and Presentation**: The ACYOA seniors hosted a Lenten dinner and presentation. Heading up the dinner were Karinne' Andonian and Tina Hagopian. Presentation was made by Nadia Silk on the "Exploration of the Liturgical Differences among the Cultures of the Oriental Orthodox Church." Members of our sister Oriental Orthodox Churches – St. Thomas Indian Orthodox Church and St. Mary Coptic Church – showed their support by attending the event.

### ANNUNCIATION

The Armenian Church celebrates the Annunciation to the Virgin Mary on April 7. The following is a meditation by Deacon Albert Keshgegian:

The Holy Spirit will come upon you and the power of the Most High will overshadow you.

(Lk. 1:35)




How would we react if an angel suddenly appeared in our daily life with a momentous message from God? That's exactly what happened to Mary, the mother of Jesus. She was just a simple young woman in an out-of-the-way place when the Archangel Gabriel appeared, telling her she was to become the mother of the Son of God. When she asked how this could happen, especially since she was not even married, the archangel responded "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the most high will overshadow you". The angel went on to say "for nothing will be impossible with God" (Lk. 1:37).

The priest says these same words every time we celebrate the Divine Litury (Soorp Badarak). The beginning of the Divine Liturgy is a time of preparation. The priest vests in kingly garments to cover his sinful nature. He washes his hands, symbolizing purification, and confesses his sins. He goes up to the altar, and, with the curtain closed, prepares the bread and wine for use later in the service. He repeats the same words over the bread and wine that the Archangel spoke to Mary. Finally, he censes the gifts of bread and wine that we are presenting to God, and the chalice, covered with a veil, is placed by the deacon in a side niche until the gifts will later be brought back to the main altar in procession.

Why these words? One of the themes of the Divine Liturgy is that it represents the entire life of Christ. In this action, the preparation of the bread and wine near the beginning of the service represents his birth. And why is the curtain closed? Because God becoming human, and being born to a virgin, is one of the great mysteries of God that we cannot understand.

Mary was a special person and chosen by God for a very special role. But God chooses each of us, too, to serve him. When we present the bread and wine as gifts to God, we are also presenting our lives as gifts to him and ourselves as sacrifice. We are saying that, as followers of Christ, we are willing to serve God according to the talents we each have. It could be organizing a food or clothing drive for the needy in our neighborhood. It could be helping with the charities for Armenia. Or doing repair work in the church or singing in the choir.

Even if we think we can't do it, we can. Because the power of the Holy Spirit will help us. With God, nothing will be impossible.


"Wow!" said the one-dollar bill. "You've really had an exciting life!"

### **CHURCH NEWS**



### WHERE THE MONEY GOES!

In the United States each church must stand on its own without financial help from the Diocese. As presented and approved at the Assembly, <u>our Church budget expense for 2012 is \$239,250 which equates to \$655/day</u>. As a non-profit organization our operating budget is to break even. In order to determine the income required, we must define our expenses.

Operating expenses are the day-to-day costs and do not include extraordinary expenses for major purchases/improvements which are handled by spending balance sheet reserves.

The pie chart to the left, which was presented at our Parish Assembly, separates our expenses into major categories. In order to understand the numbers, the categories will be broken down.

Today, we will review Building Expenses and Operating Expenses.

### Building expenses at \$62,000 include:

- Utilities (gas, electric and water) at \$34,000. We have minimized our costs with programmable thermostats, common sense temperature settings and maintenance contracts. As you can see, all precautions are taken to minimize costs yet maintain comfort.
- ✓ Insurance at \$11,000 for the church includes liability and fire/water damage.
- ✓ Snow removal at <u>\$7,500</u> is to make it safe for parishioners to attend services and meetings
- ✓ Lawn maintenance at \$4,000 is to make everything look nice including tree trimming. Our custodian has taken on the responsibility of tractor mowing the lawns.
- ✓ Heating and air conditioning at \$1,500 is for a maintenance contract.
- ✓ Waste removal @ \$3,000 was negotiated down.
- ✓ Since other items are small, they were lumped into one called other at \$1,000.

### Operating expenses at \$21,050 include:

- ✓ Telephone at \$2,000 has been renegotiated to give us an additional unlimited second line with an overall discount.
- ✓ Stationary, printing and postage at <u>\$6,000</u> is an area that we are reviewing to reduce.
- ✓ The LOOYS expense of \$1.50 per copy, per issue is being offset by advertisements which we are always trying to increase.
- ✓ Altar flowers and candles are at \$3,000.
- ✓ A combination of various smaller miscellaneous items make up the rest.




