

## A Meditation on the Passion and Crucifixion of Christ by Deacon Albert Keshgegian


"My God my God, why have you forsaken me?" (Matthew 27:46)

#### "Dear G\_d,"

In the July-September 2013 "LOOYS," Der Hagop discussed the Third Commandment, which is the Commandment proscribing the wrongful use of the name of the Lord. Der Hagop described the affirmative aspect of the Third Commandment and our duty, as Christians, to honor God's name and exalt his reputation by living our lives in harmony with His expectations. In other words, as Der Hagop explained, the deeper meaning of the Third Commandment goes beyond the simpler lesson I recall from my days in Sunday School (and the one which stuck most firmly in my head): that to



take the Lord's name in vain (whether in anger or as a point of emphasis) is a sin.

Der Hagop's discussion brought to mind something which I had, then, recently discovered.

As some of you reading this already know, in April of 2013, I was diagnosed with early-stage prostate cancer. (Ironically, my biopsy was performed on April 24th.) In August, I underwent surgery for this condition at Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center in Manhattan. Thanks, in large part, to the many prayers and wishes we received from family and friends, and, of course, the skill of the exceptional surgeons and other professionals at MSKCC, my treatment, thus far, appears to have been a success.

Truthfully, I do not think that Nané and I would have been able to endure this ordeal as well as we did without, as I said, the many prayers and good wishes of our family and friends, including the blessings bestowed on me by our dear Der Hagop and the good wishes of my close friends, including my colleagues and partners at my law firm in New York City.

Among my concerned well-wishers was one of my senior bankruptcy partners, with whom I have worked on a number of large and complex real estate transactions. This gentleman, a devout Jew, is very religious. In addition to his professional credentials (he is a graduate of the well-respected Yeshiva University in Manhattan and of the prestigious Columbia Law School), he is quite knowledgeable – indeed, I would describe him as a scholar – on all matters pertaining to Jewish history and religion.

When he first found out about my diagnosis, he expressed great concern and insisted that I seek treatment, immediately and at the best institutions possible. He also asked whether he could have my permission for him to say prayers for me (permission, I assumed, in deference to the fundamental difference in our respective religious beliefs). I thanked him for his concern and let him know that I welcomed his prayers and his good wishes.

Over the course of the ensuing months, he would constantly ask for updates as to my condition and the course of treatment and, again, would reiterate that he was keeping me in his prayers – on a daily basis as he attended services.

Shortly after, and in the days following, my surgery, Nané and I had occasion to send several emails to my work colleagues, including my Jewish partner, letting them know that the surgery had proceeded well and that I was on the road to recovery. To each one of these emails, my partner would respond with words to the effect that he was very happy to receive such good news and would always close his email with the words "Thank G d."


I was curious. Why omit the intended (obviously) letter "o?"

Initially, I assumed (and this gets me back to Der Hagop's commentary and my elementary Sunday School understanding) that this must be derivative of the Third Commandment against using the Lord's name in vain. By omitting the letter (I imagined that the reasoning went), the Commandment would not be violated. Perhaps an over-technical interpretation but, at least in my mind, made a modicum of sense.

I did some research and eventually asked my partner about it. As it turns out, I was wrong in my assumption.

What I learned (and discovered on a website called "Judaisim 101," among other sources) was that the practice, followed by observant Jews, of not spelling out the complete name does not come from the commandment not to take the Lord's name in vain. In other words, while the Third Commandment refers to the act of swearing by God's name falsely, which, as Der Hagop indicates, is certainly one of the meanings underlying the Third Commandment, it does not form the basis for the argument against writing the name "G\_d," even if in a positive context.

Instead, the practice derives from the prohibition against erasing, defacing or destroying the written name – for example, by destroying or desecrating a Bible.



Specific to the context of using the name of the Lord in an email, the website had the following discussion, which I thought was very interesting:

It is worth noting that this prohibition against erasing or defacing Names of God applies only to Names that are written in some kind of permanent form. Orthodox rabbis have held that writing on a computer is not a permanent form, thus it is not a violation to type God's Name into a computer and then backspace over it or cut and paste it, or copy and delete files with God's Name in them. However, once you print the document out, it becomes a permanent form. That is why observant Jews avoid writing a Name of God online: because there is a risk that someone else will print it out and deface it.

When I discussed this with my partner, he confirmed this view: once an email is sent or forwarded, the sender loses control over what might then occur with respect to that email. In particular, he has no ability to stop someone from printing a copy of that email, and then tossing the printed page into the trash - thereby, in effect, defacing a writing on which the name of "G\_d" appears.

As we start the New Year and prepare to celebrate Armenian Christmas, Nané and I thank G\_d for the many blessings we have received over the past year, and, above all, for the blessings of having many wonderful friends, family and colleagues who have supported us throughout what was a very trying year.







#### **Parishioners Talk About Faith**

#### **Celebrating Christian Marriage**

"Yes, Der Hayr, we are ready to renew our commitment."

With these words, over 50 married couples participated in a Service of Renewal of Marriage Vows immediately following the Divine Liturgy on Sunday, February 23. The purpose of the service, which was designed by the Christian Education Department of the Diocese, was to celebrate the sacred relationship between husband and wife—the very foundation of family life.

The short service included a reading of St. Paul's beautiful passage on love (1 Corinthians 13) and a series of questions posed by Der Hayr in which the couples replied with a resounding "We do, with God's help!" Among the most poignant was a petition to "invite Christ anew into your marriage to be the true and actual Lord of your lives as a couple, opening your hearts to his saving presence." The service ended with a blessing for "the souls of departed husbands and wives whose love for their still-living spouses remains constant." Each couple received a long-stemmed red rose before leaving the sanctuary.

Earlier during his sermon, Der Hakob preached on four principles of Christian marriage and family. They were: (1) listen to one another, even in small things; (2) keep your promises and commitments to one another in order to establish trust and lay a strong foundation; (3) encourage one another, thus "building up" as Scripture admonishes; and (4) love one another, the greatest of Christ's commands.

After Badarak, the couples, along with the entire congregation, enjoyed fellowship at a light luncheon which included a lovely cake, decorated with the words, "Celebrating Christian Marriage." The cake was cut, appropriately, by two active and devoted Holy Trinity couples, married for over 60 years: Albert and Naomi Kapeghian and Berj and Mary Yeretzian.






