# THE SACRAMENT OF PENANCE (OR PENITENCE)

Penance is a sacrament in which a person who confesses his sins receives forgiveness from the priest, being invisibly released from his sins by the Lord Jesus Christ Himself. It is true that by the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation we are saved. However, we all know that after Baptism we commit different kinds of sins until the end of our lives, which we should confess and receive forgiveness from God. There are some people who think that they can sin whenever they want, because they have the Sacrament of Penance. This thought is already sin. If the person sins knowingly and continually, he abuses God's forgiveness and in this case the Sacrament of Penance will become false.

God doesn't want a sinner to die, because we are all His children; He loves us and His mercy is unlimited. This doesn't mean that we can relax and be negligent; vice versa, we should be very careful in whatever we do or say.

It is very important for the sinner to:

- a) Repent and decide not to sin anymore.
- b) Pray by devotion and piety.
- c) Always remember that he was saved by the Blood of Jesus Christ.
- d) Try very hard to follow in Christ's footsteps.

As Christians we must be sorry for our sins, expressing to the Lord our grief for having been unfaithful to Him. First of all, we should realize our sins, and then confess them to God. It is impossible to repent without confession.

In the Armenian Apostolic Church, the Sacrament of the Penance has special rules, which are fasting, prayer, confession, repentance, good deeds, etc.


As a lay person or clergy, our responsibility is to be clean before God and to have a clear conscience.

Whoever thinks that the Sacrament of Penance is artificial or not necessary in their lives is wrong, because it is something that we need to practice during our lifetime to be acceptable to God.

If we don't feel well physically we go to a doctor. Likewise, if we don't feel peaceful in our souls, we should go to a priest (of our choice) and ask his help for spiritual guidance. Doctors cannot give us the right medicine unless they know our problem. The priest should know our spiritual problems in order to give us advice and guidance.

Dear faithful, let us use this wonderful opportunity that the Sacrament of Penance allows us, to clean our hearts and spirits from all kinds of sins, because that is the Will of God and our gain.

"If we confess our sins, He who is faithful and just will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. If we say that we have not sinned, we make Him a liar, and His word is not in us." (1 John 1:9-10).

The last three months have been very busy and a lot has been accomplished. My report by Pillar is:

#### 1. Financial

- A. We have spent the last 9 months negotiating with Spectra Energy over an easement to run their gas transmission lines under our property to the gas pumping facility across the street. We rejected their offers until the pipeline was laid out so that it would not affect the aesthetics of our property and they reached a final value acceptable to us. The Parish Council has unanimously agreed to accept the deal; we have received the preliminary OK from the Diocese (the property is owned by the Diocese) and will present it to the Parish for approval at the Assembly or a special Assembly January 8.
- B. The Investment Committee was enlarged to five members and gave a presentation in November of their goals and strategies.
- C. We will also invest some funds in ACEF to generate an annual income of 4.5% of the investment portfolio value.



- A. We have leaks in the dome again, especially during heavy northeastern winds and rains. The estimate to solve the entire problem is \$13,000 and will be done when the weather is right.
- B. Sunday School's remodeling was completed under our \$9,000 budget
- C. Concrete landings and steps in front of the Church will be completed next Spring at a cost of \$10,000
- D. The dumpster contract was re-negotiated which will save us \$2,100/yr
- E. The copier will have to be replaced since parts are no longer available.
- F. The new pew cushions were received and installed in November.
- G. Hall rentals for 2012 are at zero thus far

#### 3. Membership

- A. All potential members were contacted for payment of dues. The dues constitute 15% of our income; provide savings on all Rites and hall rentals and provide the right to vote.
- B. A similar approach was used for Stewardship, which provides another 15% of our income.




#### 4. Spiritual

- A. Der Hayr advised in his report of the many hospital/home visits he is making and the Rites he is performing
- B. ACYOA Srs. met with Council to describe their programs and needs for the coming year and have their own Bible study group
- C. Church participation (altar + choir + parishioners) is increasing which is great to see.
- D. When is the last time, if ever, that we had TEN Ordinations on one Sunday or even in one year?
- E. Armenian school has begun its second year and introduced us to new people.

#### 5. Events

- A. The 45th Anniversary celebration was a joyous event. I believe that it was the largest crowd we have had in years
- B. Our Bazaar was affected by a snowy Saturday, but again we had a great Sunday.

#### **CELEBRATION OF DECADES AND THE DAY**

On November 20<sup>th</sup>, Holy Trinity Armenian Church commemorated the 45th Anniversary of the consecration of its current Church in Cheltenham, Pennsylvania. Divine Liturgy was celebrated by His Eminence Archbishop Khajag Barsamian, Primate of the Eastern Diocese of the Armenian Church of America, and a special ceremony was held where he ordained five Tbirs (Daniel Aslanian, Shawn Carnavale, Frederick Jordan, Andrew Movsesian and Bryan Peckjian) and five Sub-Deacons (Michael Alexanian, James Keshgegian, Harout Nalbandian, Bryan Peckjian and Chris Torcomian), into the Church family.

In his pastoral message, Archbishop Barsamian focused on the simple words of Jesus, "Follow Me." He encouraged the audience to listen to Jesus, "to join Him, to become close to Him, to walk in His footsteps and to know Him more intimately." His Eminence continued by discussing this year's Diocesan theme of lay ministry and explaining how we can all incorporate this task into our daily lives.

Following Badarak, over 250 people attended the celebratory dinner banquet. Holy Trinity's pastor Rev. Fr. Hakob Gevorgyan welcomed His Eminence Archbishop Barsamian, expressed gratitude to the banquet committee and all the attendees. Special guests included V. Rev. Fr. Oshagan Gulgulian, Pastor of St. Sahag and St. Mesrob Armenian Church, Wynnewood, PA; Rev. Fr. Karekin Kasparian, Pastor of St. Gregory Armenian Church, White Plains, NY; Rev. Fr. Vertanes Kalayjian, retired Pastor of St. Mary's Armenian Church, Washington, DC; and Sisters Arousiag and Emma from the Armenian Sisters Academy.

The Primate's address delivered an inspiring message. "We are united in our faith. We are all connected through the Armenian Church," said Archbishop Barsamian. "And today's celebration is a wonderful sign that we can continue the mission of our *Lord* Jesus Christ. In continuation of our mission, let us remember that each of us has a role."

Later in the program, six individuals who have been faithful servants over the last several decades and who have had an important impact on Holy Trinity were recognized as "pillars" of the Church. "These people are people of passion. I believe that I have a lot to see and to learn from them," Der Hakob said. The honorees of this "St. Vartan Award", presented by Archbishop Barsamian, were Robert and Lorraine Damerjian, Larry and Jeanette DerHagopian, John Kash

and Merle Santerian. Each of these parishioners has served in Parish Council and other Church leadership roles.

Recipient Merle Santerian, former Parish Council chairperson, active member of the Church and Armenian community, said "this was a wonderful way of bringing our community together. I am grateful and blessed to have the opportunity to contribute to this parish and I am honored to have received this beautiful award."

The attendees enjoyed graceful Armenian musical performances by local artists Dr. Andre



Garabedian and Greg and Karinne' Andonian. Throughout the afternoon, a slide show of photographs portrayed "then" and "now" of the Church and its parish from 1966 and 2011. It was a meaningful and beautiful tribute to our pillars, parents and grandparents who helped build the Church following a fire that destroyed the former location in *North* Philadelphia. Addressing the group, Der Hakob said "today, we thank God, our Almighty Lord, because he gave us the opportunity to have this beautiful Church and this beautiful property. I know your parents and you worked very hard for this Church. And now you are enjoying the fruit of your labor."

"I was pleasantly surprised to see all the people, especially the representation by our friends from all of the other Philadelphia-area Armenian churches," said Tanya Paretchan, lifetime parishioner of Holy Trinity. "Events like this bring everyone together as a community and ignite energy among us. We couldn't ask for anything better than that."

Sunday's festivities were a reminder of our Armenian Christian faith and strength. Appropriately, this weekend in our Church calendar was the Feast of All Saints - Old and New, Known and Unknown. Saints are those who lived a virtuous life, those renowned for their faith and service to the Church, those who were martyred for their faith, and those worthy of heavenly favor. On this anniversary occasion, we saw some of these traits in all those involved.

Coming together to celebrate 45 years of history was the result of collaborated efforts and service by the entire Church parish and local Armenians. When we work together and are guided foremost by the Holy *Word*, we can transcend challenges and grow stronger as a community. "Indeed, this is an honored occasion to be thankful about," said Archbishop Barsamian. "It gives us an opportunity to express our common faith; thus indicating that we are a living Armenian Church and in our togetherness we can answer God's call."







Christ in our midst has been revealed; He Who Is God is here seated. The voice of peace has resounded; Holy greeting is commanded. The kiss is given for a full bond. The enmity has been removed; And love is spread over us all.



--from Hymn of the Kiss of Peace


It's an age-old dream of humanity, a dream we all share: a world without war, strife, enmity or hatred. A world where peace reigns and everyone treats everyone else with love. This dream will probably never come true in our imperfect world, but it already exists in God's Kingdom in heaven and in the representative of his Kingdom on earth – the Church.

The person who brought us this peace was Jesus Christ, the Son of God, and part of the Holy Trinity, who became human to reconcile us with God. God had given us his laws to obey, and humanity had repeatedly broken them. But rather than punishing us, God, out of his love for us, chose to send his Son to become one of us, to show us the immensity of God's love, and to suffer and die so that we would not have to. Christ brought us the message of God's love, of how we can become right with God, and share in the peace and joy of his Kingdom forever.

During the Divine Liturgy, at the beginning of the portion called the Holy Sacrifice, the bread and wine, representing our offering to God but also Christ's body and blood, are brought in procession to the altar from the side niche or altar where they had been placed after being prepared earlier in the service. In some ways the Divine Liturgy

represents all of Christ's life, and the bringing of the bread and wine to the altar indicates that Christ has come into our lives and is now actually among us. As Christ himself said, "For where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in the midst of them" (Mt. 18:20). In a real sense, he is now "seated" on the altar. We celebrate the coming of Christ, our reconciliation with God, and our unity in his Church, by giving each other the Kiss of Peace and singing its hymn.

Early Christians often greeted each other with a "holy kiss"; St. Paul ended a number of his epistles by writing "Greet one another with a holy kiss" (for example, Rom. 16:16). Once Christ is in our midst in the Divine Liturgy, we can and should do the same. It is a dramatic sight to see the "Voghchooyn" (greeting) come down from the altar (representing heaven) and move through the entire congregation pew-by-pew from the



front to the back. As we have become reconciled with God through Christ, so must we become reconciled with each other. Only in that way can we truly become part of Christ's body, which he is offering for us as sacrifice, and which also is his Church. As Christ commanded, "So when you are offering your gift at the altar, if you remember that your brother or sister has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar and go; first be reconciled to your brother or sister, and then come and offer your gift" (Mt. 5:23). The first epistle of John (1Jn. 4:20) goes on to tell us "Those who say, 'I love God,' and hate their brothers or sisters, are liars; for those who do not love a brother or sister whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen".

How do we respond to the coming of Christ and his words for us? Is the Kiss of Peace an action that we just ceremonially perform on Sunday mornings, or is it something that guides our entire life? How do we treat others? With love and respect, as we ourselves would wish to be treated, or as people that we must fight with or brush past in order to obtain our own selfish desires?

Only if the love of God and the peace of Christ rule our lives can we truly participate fully in his Church and look forward to the time when this world of enmity and hatred ends and the Kingdom of God on earth begins. Only when peace is in our hearts and love is truly spread over us all can we meaningfully exclaim to each other the words of the Kiss of Peace:

- -- Krisdos ee mech mer haydnetsav. Christ has been revealed among us!
- -- Orhnyal eh haydnootyoonun Krisdosee. Blessed is the revelation of Christ!

#### IN MEMORIAM

#### Armen Joseph Alahverde, Sr.

Loving Husband, nurturing Father, proud Grandfather and great Grandfather, Armen Joseph Alahverde, Sr., 92, a lifelong resident of the Philadelphia area and longtime resident of Montgomery County, Pennsylvania joined God's kingdom this past Monday, October 10, 2011. Armen is survived by his loving wife of 52 years, Doris and their daughter Faith (Jose) & son Joseph (Maria). Armen is also survived by his oldest sons Armen Jr. & Stephen (Helene), a sister Arpen Agasar of Langhorne, seven grandchildren and eight great grandchildren.

Armen was born in 1919 to Sophia (nee Keworkian) Alahverde and Joseph Stephan Alahverde, both Armenian immigrants who came from Persia to Philadelphia in the early 1900s.

Armen served honorably during the 1930s in The Fairmount Park Cavalry Division of The PA. National Guard and later in the U.S. Army. He ran a successful painting contractor business for 70 years by trade, and was actively working until early 2011.

Armen was a self-educated man, and family and friends admired his encyclopedic knowledge and conversation on a variety of subjects. He passed on this love of learning to his children, grandchildren, and great grandchildren, in particular through his knack for telling stories and jokes.

In his spare time, Armen enjoyed studying and speaking foreign languages including Armenian, Assyrian, Arabic, French, Latin & Farsi. He loved to peruse the bookshelves of local resale shops searching for old tomes and interesting artifacts. Old books about ancient history were particular favorites.

Armen was an avid herb gardener who always gave credit to God for the abundant harvest of his lovingly tended garden. He prepared and gave away his homemade cheese spread with his garden grown herbs. Each fall, Armen proudly donated his bumper crop of basil for the Blessing Of The Basil/Transfiguration of the Cross celebration at Holy Trinity Armenian Apostolic Church in Cheltenham.

In 1979, Armen was commended for bravery by The Philadelphia Police Department for his assistance in the apprehension of an armed robber.

Armen was a hardworking man whose life revolved around family, God, pride in country & love of learning. Armen had a charitable heart and lent a hand to his fellow man as well as God's creatures.

He was loved by his customers, friends, neighbors & fellow parishioners of the two churches he attended, Immanuel Lutheran Church in Burholme, and Holy Trinity Armenian Apostolic Church in Cheltenham.

An evening viewing was held Sunday, October 16<sup>th</sup> from 7-9 PM with a service at 8 p.m. at Holy Trinity Armenian Apostolic Church, 101 Ashmead Rd. Cheltenham, Pa. 19012. Monday morning, October 17<sup>th</sup>, a viewing will be held at Holy Trinity from 10-11 AM, with a service at 11 am and burial at Lawnview Cemetery, 500 Huntingdon Pike Rockledge, PA. 19046.

#### Remembering Mary and Kappy Kapeghian

Kappy and Mary were both eight years old when they first met in 1931 at the marriage of Haig and Ovsanna Injaian. Most of the guests took the Delaware River Ferry to get across the Delaware River into Camden, New Jersey, where the wedding was to take place. At the reception, a little boy (Kappy) made a great impression on Mary when he helped her get a bottle of orange soda out of a huge metal washtub filled with ice and water.

It was ironic that years later they should meet again, but this time through wartime correspondence. During World War II, Kappy (Junior, as he is known to his family) enlisted in the U.S. Army Air Corps. A fellow GI bunkmate, John Kerner, told Kappy he was writing to a "nice, young, pretty Armenian girl." John Kerner was from Philadelphia and lived about three blocks from Mary's house. He was the best friend of her brother John.

Kappy's curiosity was piqued, and he asked if he could also write to John's "pen pal." Correspondence was the next move, and the lonely GI sent a letter and picture to Mary. This was the beginning of their brief courtship through love letters. Kappy's picture was eventually seen by Ovsanna while visiting the Autian family. To her surprise, she recognized the soldier as "our Junior." From then on, Ovsanna was instrumental in arranging their first meeting.

Months later, after seeing each other twice on two separate furloughs, Uncle Charlie, Aunt Florence and Rose Kapeghian visited the Autian family with Junior. They asked Mary's father for her hand in marriage. That was on Wednesday, April 19, 1944.

Mary bought her wedding dress. It was called a furlough dress because it could be purchased at a moment's notice. The bridesmaids borrowed their dresses - each of a different color. She didn't worry about the ushers; they had their uniforms. The Kapeghian family and Ovsanna made all the wedding arrangements such as food, pictures, invitations by phone, etc., and in three days, the wedding took place. They were married on April 23, 1944, at Holy Trinity Armenian Church at Susquehanna and Marshall Streets. Haig Injaian was the Best Man and Ovsanna Sarafian Injaian was the Matron of Honor; little Margie, their daughter, was the Flower Girl.

It's still amazing that so much was accomplished in such a short time. Kappy was sent overseas as World War II continued. Mary stayed with her parents until her new husband came home in December, 1945. So, the hasty wartime marriage between a young, naive couple did survive

through sixty-four years, three children and four grandchildren.

Now they are together once again.

This past October I had the honor, along with my daughter Ana, my niece Sara, and my sister Millicent, to participate in the SUSAN G. KOMAN 3 DAY FOR THE CURE - a sixty-mile walk raising funds to find a cure for Breast Cancer and help women obtain mammograms and information necessary to live a life without this disease.

This was Ana's idea last February and it quickly became a family affair especially when we discovered that the final day of the walk, October 16<sup>th</sup>, would have been my sister Gloria's 61<sup>st</sup> birthday. I lost my sister to Breast Cancer when she was 42 years old ... .this would be a wonderful way to remember her and celebrate her life.

We trained over the summer spending hours walking together, but mostly alone. Finally, after many months, our weekend arrived.



It was an amazing weekend with a sea of people in pink! But beyond the hundreds of walkers - men & women, young & old - were the volunteers who were also involved in the weekend. They were a constant source of encouragement and strength. They fed us, kept us safe and mended us at the end of the day. We knew how really important they were on the second day of the walk at about the 18<sup>th</sup> mile.

We were on the River Drive heading back to the city; no cheering crowds giving us snacks, no sweep vans to beep at us and rescue us from our pain....it was just us and our feet, and I didn't know if I could go another step, let alone another 5 miles.

So I began to think of my sister and all she endured fighting the cancer and for her right to raise her young children....what I was doing could not even compare. So we began to sing her favorite songs and we did it.... We finished our day!

Our third and last day was great. We spent a great time with Nancy Hovnanian and Karinne Andonian enjoying South Philly and cheese steaks. Our finish at the Navy Yard was once again an incredible sea of pink energy from people cheering for you and the sixty-mile accomplishment. We were blessed to have many of our supporting friends and family surprise us by joining us for the Closing Ceremonies. But it was the final moments of the ceremony that touched me the most.


Breast Cancer survivors walk into the ceremony last. Nancy and I were linked arm-in-arm with other survivors, with Nancy on my right and a young woman on my left. Everyone began sharing how many years they've survived. I realized this young woman could have only been in her late 20's or early 30's when diagnosed. As I looked around at this army of women, arm-in-arm, I saw more young faces, more than I'd first realized, and at that moment it was clear.....this was more than celebrating my sister's memory, it was for our daughters and our granddaughters so that, hopefully, they may never know this disease.

For Ana, the unbearable pain in her feet and the shin splints didn't matter anymore once she entered the Naval Yard and felt the warmth of the crowds and the love of our friends and family. Sharing the 3-Day Walk with her aunt, cousin, mom, Karinne and Aunt Nancy made all the struggles completely worth it and felt it was the most emotional and amazing experience of her entire life.

Our team, Team Gloria, raised over \$10,000 to fight Breast Cancer. Thank you once again, everyone, for your support.




#### **ARMENIAN INDEPENDENCE DAY: New York Celebration**




