

community. As a unified body our common interest was and is to preach and teach the Gospel of Jesus Christ to our people and to preserve our Armenian identity. Learning Jesus' teachings is the first step for every Christian community. The second step is to practice His teachings in our daily life.

Over the years, our Holy Trinity community has provided a spiritual nourishment to our people. In our community people love, respect and care for one another. When someone is sick, we pray for him/her; when someone grieves, we grieve with him/her; and when someone celebrates, we celebrate with him/her. We try to help each other in any way we can.

Today because of Covid-19, our world is facing many difficulties. People can't visit their loved ones in the hospital or in the nursing home. People can't visit church or any other religious organization. People can't get baptized or married. The funerals must be conducted with limited people at the graveside only. Millions of people lost their jobs. Many people are sick and, sadly, many others have died. And the big question is that no one knows how long this situation will last. But we should remember that on this earth, everything has a beginning and end.

Now, as a community, what can we do to help our people?

When this problem started, we began to livestream our services for our community so we could pray together. Thanks to our deacons, choir members and professionals for their technical support. Our leadership (Parish Council

members) started continually to call our parishioners and check on their well-being. People called me and offered their help especially for elderly parishioners. Every day, I see more and more caring attitude and love towards each other. WE are a community!

Parish Council News

All. I hope each of you are doing well and that everyone you know is well. During this time, the Parish Council has met via telephone conference, usually once a week, to discuss the changing environment and the issues we have and anticipate for the balance of this year.

Initially, asset protection. Our assets are our investments, both those held with the Investment Committee and those held in ACEF. In each instance, we have lost some money, but in each instance, we have implemented stop-loss protections. ACEF has built in loss protections and we follow the strategy of the Diocese in that investment. The Investment Committee has kept close touch with Michael Santerian and with me and we determined to pull out of the markets for a portion of our investments and hold that amount in cash. I suggested that we hold one year of our operating costs in cash and we are doing that.

Second, we have cash in the bank and cash in the Estate of Serpouhie Tchmiyan accounts. We also hold a private mortgage. So, we have money and we can withstand this crisis. It doesn't mean we don't always need donors to help; it means we can survive this crisis.

Next, we applied and received Payroll Protection Plan funds of approximately \$29,000 to help cover our payroll, medical and utilities costs for 8 weeks. That money came through my banker at Columbia Bank. Our existing bank, Santander didn't answer us on whether we could apply for those funds. We are re-thinking our relationship with Santander as a result.

On the personnel side, Tyrome has moved on to a new job. That change for him was not related to the pandemic. Maggie has been working from home as the Church Office is formally closed. We have hired a young Parishioner to cut our grass, a maintenance person to clean the Church and we have coverage for hall rental events when we are able to have hall rentals again.

On the personal side, Don Paretchan suggested we provide an Armenian dinner to some of our Parishioners whom Der Hayr identified as persons who would appreciate that gesture more than most in this time of crisis. That effort has been very well received. People knowing that the Church community cares for and about them is not fully understood until you see and hear the reaction of those affected by the effort. Thank you, Don, Der Hayr, Gay and Arous who arranged and delivered the meals. We did not do this as "the Parish Council" necessarily as we obtained individual donors to support fully the effort; no Parishioner monies were used.

Finally, as proof that out of bad comes good, Der Hayr has been conducting weekly video-conference sessions with the Church School students. This is just terrific and the children have the benefit of Der Hayr's teachings much like their other academics at this time.

Finally, finally, your officers for this year are me, Larry, Don, Liz, and Michael. Thank you to my fellow Council members for allowing me to help again this year. This Church means so much to me and leadership matters much more in crisis than in the everyday of operations, but the everyday operations position you for responding to crisis. I am thankful to have a role in that leadership.



A Reflection

"This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it" (Psalm 118:24).

It's been a strange, difficult, foreign, frightening time. Needing to stay in our homes, venturing out only for essentials with a covering on our face, staying a safe distance away from other people, washing our hands frequently according to the prescribed method. Worried about catching Covid-19, with its possibility of severe disease and even death. And of course our hearts go out to those who have lost loved ones to the disease.

It's hard to know what the exact situation will be when you read this, but some form of "social distancing" guidelines will still be in place and the virus will still be a threat. How have people coped with their concerns and fears? Individuals have turned to various sources for support and consolation. Some tune to the cable news channels for updates several times during the day. Some try to escape with movies or TV shows. For those of us who are the faithful, there are numerous Bible verses that promise the constant and ongoing presence, strength, and support of God, for example:

God is our refuge and our strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change, though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea; though its water roar and foam, though the mountains tremble with its tumult. (Psalm 46:1-3)

Do not fear, for I am with you, do not be afraid, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my victorious right hand. (Isaiah 41:10)

Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. (Philippians 4:6-7)

It's important to remember in times like this that God and his strength and peace are always with us. But there's another Bible verse that I think is important for today: *This is the day that the Lord has made.*

It is God who created the sun and the earth and the land and the water. It is God who created the plants and the animals and gave us the gift of life. God made the world and everything in it. He makes the sun rise every morning, even if clouds may obscure it, to provide us light and warmth. Every day is a day made by God and given to us as a gift by him, even if it is in the midst of a pandemic.

This is the day that the Lord has made.

As I write this, trees and bushes are in bloom in a myriad of colors. The beauty and majesty of nature are in full display. Most of us have adequate food and shelter and financial security. We have friends and family that we can stay in touch with, even though we can't physically touch them. Every morning we should rise and rejoice and be glad and thank God for all his good gifts.

This is the day that the Lord has made.

But we also need to do more. God gave us this day, and he wants us to use it to do something meaningful, something that will please and glorify him. The virus has reminded us of how our behavior can affect others and how much all of us are connected with each other and need each other. We can follow the guidelines and requirements to minimize the spread of the virus. We can look out for our neighbors. We can call them just to check in on their well-being and to offer them human contact. We can offer to do grocery shopping or pick up medicines for those who are more at risk for the virus than we are. We can provide a meal or other aid to a neighbor who has lost their job. We can donate to food banks or the other charities in the US and Armenia that are taking care of those who have been affected the most.

This is the day that the Lord has made.

We should embrace it, appreciate it, rejoice and be glad in it, and use it to do God's good works.

Armenians are people of faith while at the same time, those same people with whom we worship become part of our extended families. By mid-March, when the Coronavirus became the main topic of news, it soon became apparent that our lives would be changed almost instantly. And in the blink of an eye, our churches were fully shut down, depriving us of our time of worship in the Sanctuary and Hospitality time with our extended family.

Social distancing became a new phrase added to the dictionary; sanitizers and masks were as important as food. And we stayed home!

The leadership, under the direction of Der Hakob with the Parish Council, immediately began to plan ways to stay connected with our church community. Uplifting messages from Der Hayr and other updates were e-blasted and snail-mailed regularly; shut-ins were called on a regular basis by many caring members to make sure all of them had whatever they needed. But we were missing Church!



Once the mechanics were worked out, the Lenten services

were conducted and streamed through the Holy Trinity Facebook page, with Der Hayr and two deacons participating. Interestingly enough, there were more people viewing online than the number who usually attend the Friday night Peace and Rest Services. It was clear that while many might not attend church often, they certainly missed it if it wasn't available to them!

Palm Sunday dawned as we watched online – and even participated in - a memorable service, unlike any other: priest, two deacons and two choir members. And yet it was AWESOME! Well over one hundred people watched the service with comments of praise and thanksgiving.

As of this writing, we are still NOT finished with COVID-19, so we don't really know the ending yet. But along the way, perhaps we began to learn some things.

- We didn't like the isolation, but we were managing it.
- We live in a country of plenty and we are blessed to be able to go out and buy whatever we want at a moment's notice, but that stopped during this time. And we saw that we were able to do without those extra items that we thought we needed.
- Sharing dinners together as a family really was wonderful.
- Many could not get to the food stores, so we depended on the kindness of family, friends and neighbors to help us. And though the items were not just what we wanted, we made do and were fine.
- We spent more time on the phone "visiting" with people. Hopefully, we spent more time with God and in prayer. We interacted by playing games with our grandchildren on computers or phones, something that might not happen in "normal" circumstances.

Hopefully, these lessons will stay with us when we return to our "other normal life" as we work to amend the priorities in our lives.

With Gay Hagopian at the helm, the operation was carried out smoothly and efficiently. The delivery team included Der Hayr, Gay, Barbara Harmon, Arousiag Keshishian, Don Paretchan and Nick Terkanian. As of this writing, meals are still being delivered.

We are delighted to share just a few of the many comments from the recipients: can't begin to say how good the food was - from appetizers, main course to dessert..... moved to tears to be remembered by my church family.... so humbled to be thought of this way.... extremely grateful and it warmed my heart.... cannot believe how lucky I am not only to get dinner, but delivery as well... portions so generous, I had more than two meals with it.... And on and on it went.

Thank you to this outstanding team and the generous donors who worked together to provide delicious meals to shut-ins which warmed not only their stomachs but also their hearts!


