THE GOLDEN RULE

Another Bible verse can help us to understand the Golden Rule. "Do not be deceived, God is not mocked; for whatever a man sows, that he will also reap" (Galatians 6:7).

Dear Faithful, if we want to see peace, harmony, a forgiving attitude, mutual understanding, respect and love in our relationships, then we should plant them first. And, of course, when we do or say something, we should think twice about how it will affect the other person. Amen

OUR NEW PASTORAL ASSISTANT

Dn. Armen Terjimanian was born on June 2, 1982, in Royal Oak, MI to Arsen and Shoghig Terjimanian and raised in Troy, MI. He has two younger brothers, Dr. Michael Terjimanian and Stephen Terjimanian.

A 2000 graduate of Troy (MI) High School, he attended the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor and graduated in 2004 with a Bachelor of Arts in Film & Video Studies and Political Science. He then attended Columbia University in New York, where he graduated with a Master of Science in Journalism in 2005. He spent his secular working career as a web content and online producer in the Washington, DC, region, working at USA TODAY Sports (August 2005-November 2010) and Georgetown University's Office of Communications (December 2010-February 2015).

In February 2015, Armen moved to Armenia where he participated in Birthright Armenia for eight months, volunteering his writing and communications expertise at a number of organizations including CivilNet, Children of Armenia Fund (COAF), PicsArt in Yerevan, Artsakh Press and the Government of the Republic of Nagorno-Karabakh in Stepanakert. He returned to Detroit in October 2015 until August 2016, when he moved to New York and worked for AGBU and later the Eastern Diocese as a communications



consultant. During his time at the Eastern Diocese, Armen realized that he had a calling to serve the Armenian Church and made the decision to attend St. Nersess Armenian Seminary.

Armen grew up attending St. John Armenian Church along with his family, where his father Arsen has taught Sunday School for almost 30 years. He was baptized at St. John and graduated from the Sunday School. During his teenage years, he started serving on the altar as an acolyte and was ordained as a tbir by then-Primate His Eminence Archbishop Khajag Barsamian in 1995. When Rev. Fr. Garabed Kochakian became St. John's pastor, Armen continued his altarserving education, learning how to swing a poorvar and chant the deacon's portions of the Badarak. As part of a graduate school course in Religion Reporting, Armen visited Jerusalem and the Armenian Quarter for the first time in 2005, which helped cement his faith. He returned to the Holy Land in 2007 with a Diocesan pilgrimage and again in 2018 as part of his St. Nersess Seminary studies.

When Armen moved to Washington, he attended St. Mary Armenian Church and served on the altar. In 2008, he was ordained a Subdeacon by then-Primate Archbishop Khajag Barsamian. Armen was very active in the parish, serving St. Mary in numerous capacities from ACYOA Seniors chair to substitute Sunday School teacher. In 2013 he was elected to the St. Mary Parish Council and served one term until 2015. Armen also was active on the national ACYOA front, participating in numerous retreats, conferences, and General Assembly/Sports Weekends. In 2011, he was appointed to the ACYOA Central Council and served in the executive body until 2014.





A REFLECTION BY DEACON ALBERT KESHGEGIAN

You have been blessed so you can bless others — Rep. Elijah Cummings

You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hid. No one after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven. (Matthew 5:14-16)

Within the past year this country lost two long-term, well-respected U.S. congressmen, Rep. Elijah Cummings and Rep. John Lewis. Both had also been active in the civil rights movement. Rep. Cummings' colleagues described him as "the best among us," kind, humble, thoughtful, a "man of God," passionate and a mentor. Rep. Lewis was called "the conscience of Congress." When they passed away, both were greatly mourned and praised, and their bodies lay in state in the U.S. Capitol building.

Both of them were also known as powerful orators and quotes from them were all over the news. One of the quotes that Rep. Cummings was noted for was especially meaningful and moving for me and is above: "You have been blessed so you can bless others," paraphrasing a number of Bible verses.

What does this quote mean? Most of us are so blessed in this country, despite the ongoing pandemic. We have abundant food, good housing, and enough income to enjoy our lives in addition to providing for all the necessities. We have the freedom to say and believe in what we want and the opportunity to advance as far as we can in education and careers. All these blessings, and many more, come ultimately from God, who loves us and wants the best for us and is the source of everything that is good.

However, with these blessings also come responsibilities. We need, in turn, to bless others.

Jesus came as the light of the world (Jn. 8:12) to illuminate our souls and minds to see the path that leads to God. But he taught us that we, in turn, are also to be the light of the world. Just as one would not light a lamp and hide it, but would use that lamp to provide light, we need to let our light shine before others, to show them good works, to show that our light reflects the glory of God and the path that leads to him.

On a more personal basis, we can locate people in our church or community who need help – someone elderly who could use assistance with getting to appointments or grocery shopping, someone sad or lonely who wants a person to talk to or bring them the comfort of God, someone ill who would like a friend to read them a favorite book or cook them a special treat or just be with them.

Whatever we do, we will be shining the light of God in us to others. And we will be blessing others, just as we ourselves have been blessed.



HOLY TRINITY ZOOMS INTO THE 21ST CENTURY

In an effort to provide faith-based initiatives to Holy Trinity parishioners, the ACE team sponsored two separate opportunities to bring our faithful together. Albert Keshgegian who compared lyrics from Elvis Presley's gospel music to Scripture passages and prayers from the Armenian Church. Leslie Movsesian, our Christian Education Church School Superintendent, presented "Art and Faith Talk: Expressing Joy." Participants were treated to several of her very personal creations inspired by the writings of St. Paul and her life in the Church. The final presentation, "Does Jesus Want Us to be Poor?" was an astute and informative commentary on the first Beatitude, "Blessed are the poor in spirit for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." This last evening in the series was guided by Dn. Eric Vozzy, a staffer in the Department of Creative Ministries at the Diocese.

While all who participated in these interactive programs were appreciative for the opportunity to learn more about their faith and be "together," it is unfortunate that so few of our community members were present. Hopefully, that will change in the future.


