The mission of the Armenian Apostolic Orthodox Church is to preach the Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ and to proclaim its message of salvation. All the faithful of the Armenian Church - both clergy and laity - are called to participate fully in this mission.

FEAR OR FAITH?

I believe most of the people during their lifetime have had, at least once, fear in their hearts, which is normal because we are human beings. But to live with fear all the time is not normal and healthy.

In the Bible we read the following, "The Lord Himself goes before you and will be with you; He will never leave you nor forsake you. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged" (Deuteronomy 31: 8). I am sure we all have examples from our life about how many times God did help or rescue us from storms or difficulties. But often we have a short memory. We forget that the same God who helped us before will do the same thing again today if we have faith in Him, if we call His name.

When we travel or go to any place, we like to have someone with us. That way our trip becomes more interesting and enjoyable. Our life is a journey. During this journey we have with us not only our family members and friends, but most importantly, we have God with us. The same God who created us, who walks with us every day and who leads us into His kingdom. God always likes to hold our hand but we are the ones who leave His hand and wander around and try to find comfort and safety in the wrong places.

Even Jesus' disciples who were with Him most of the time of His ministry and saw all of His miracles had doubt and fear. "One day Jesus said to His disciples, 'Let us go across to the other side of the lake.' So they put out, and while they were sailing He fell asleep. A windstorm swept down on the lake, and the boat was filling with water, and they were in danger. They went to Him and woke Him up, shouting, 'Master, Master, we are perishing!' And He woke up and rebuked the wind

and the raging waves; they ceased, and there was calm. He said to them, 'Where is your faith?' They were afraid and amazed, and said to one another, 'Who then is this, that He commands even the winds and the water, and they obey Him?'" (Luke 8:22-25).

Our soldiers in Armenia and Artsakh are good examples of faith and bravery. I don't know any other country in the world where soldiers are living in trenches for a few decades to protect their country from the enemy. Our soldiers don't have luxurious conditions in which to live and serve. They serve during the day and at night, during hot and cold weather, without heat and electricity, while the enemy is brutal and shrewd. The faith of our soldiers in God and love towards our homeland makes them fearless and gives them courage and inspiration to stand firm. We can learn a lot from our 18- 19- and 20-year-old soldiers who sacrifice their lives knowingly and willingly, so that we can have our homeland.

Dear Faithful, as in many things we have choices. In this case also, we have a choice between fear and faith. Let us strive to choose faith.



A Reflection by Deacon Albert Keshgegian

When I consider your heavens. the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars. which you have set in place. what is mankind that you are mindful of them, human beings that you care for them? You have made them a little lower than the angels and crowned them with glory and honor. You made them rulers over the works of your hands; you put everything under their feet: all flocks and herds, and the animals of the wild. the birds in the sky. and the fish in the sea. all that swim the paths of the seas. LORD, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth! (Psalm 8:3-9)

It's a day that's been celebrated yearly since 1970. At first only in the United States, in 1990 it became global. On April 22 we celebrate Earth Day, now in 193 countries involving over one billion people, to demonstrate support for environmental protection.

People are urged to reduce, reuse, and recycle. To decrease their use of plastic and the sizes of packaging. To plant more trees and native plants. To conserve water and energy. Even to use longer-life light bulbs.

Part of the concern for environment is pollution. Single-use plastics are a problem. There is an island of floating plastic pieces in the Pacific that is three times the size of France. Multiple human activities add chemicals and unwanted particles to the air we breathe, potentially affecting our health.

A major part of the concern for the environment is the presence of climate change. Although the reasons for this have been debated, most scientists think it is due to human actions, such as carbon emissions (e.g., from automobile exhaust or factories), deforestation (because trees remove carbon dioxide from the air), and so on.

No matter what the cause, there is no doubt that climate change is happening, and the effects are a serious problem. The year 2020 was the second hottest globally in history. Since 2000 we have seen 19 of the hottest years on record. Storms are more severe, droughts are increasing. Less rainfall in many areas, especially in the West, is resulting in smaller crop yields, financial problems for farmers, and more expensive food for all. Hurricanes, tornados, and forest fires leave many homeless, injured, or worse.

Earth Day reminds us that we need to work together now, not later, to save our planet and its natural resources. It's an absolute imperative.

Even more importantly, it's what God wants us to do.

Genesis tells us that God created humans to have dominion, to be in charge of, all that he created on earth. The psalm above reminds us of this. God is so much greater than humans. His power created the moon and planets and stars. His power created all that exists on earth. And yet he put humans, beings lower than the angels, in charge of his creations.

We don't own this planet or anything on it, all of which is God's. We are caretakers, to merely preserve, care for, and make more abundant the goodness around us. When we do the opposite, when we contribute to pollution, climate change, and their deleterious effects, we are going against the will of God.

God wants us to praise him and glorify him by doing all we can to protect the environment, not only for the benefit of everyone alive today, but also for all the generations of our children and grandchildren that are to come.

The Bible in the Armenian Church

The following is the third installment of a four-part adult education series on the Bible in the Armenian Church, written by Rev. Fr. Vazken Movsesian of the Western Diocese of the Armenian Church.

OTHER BOOKS

Toward the end of the second century AD, there were all sorts of books existing in the Christian communities. For example, there was the Gospel of Thomas, or, as the author called his book, The Secret Words Which Jesus the Living Spoke and Jude Thomas Wrote Down. This book is a compilation of 118 different sayings attributed to Jesus. Some believe it to be a more complete Sermon on the Mount. Some of the passages in this book are also found in the Gospels of St. Matthew and St. Luke.

There was also a book called the Gospel of the Infancy of Jesus Christ. It is one of the more fascinating books of what is called the New Testament apocrypha or "hidden books." This book is a compilation of stories relating to the young Jesus. Many of these stories seem to be derived from events and occurrences in the synoptic Gospels. One story relates how Jesus, while still in the cradle, looks up at his mother and says, "Mary, I am the Son of God." Another story is generated from the account of the anointing of Jesus by Mary Magdalene. The story claims an old lady kept Jesus' navel string in an alabaster box of old oil of spikenard. It was out of this box that Mary took the oil to anoint Jesus. Still another story relates how Jesus, and some other young boys were molding clay figures of animals. Upon Jesus' command, the clay figures that He made begin to walk and fly. The entire book is filled with miraculous stories of this nature. Some other books of this genre include, The Gospel of Nicodemus, The Gospel of Peter, the Epistle of Jesus Christ and Abgarus the King of Edessa.

So, the early Church Fathers had before them many books relating in some fashion or form to the Lord Jesus Christ. After studying these books and sifting through their content they had to decide which were authentic and which were fictitious and/or represented a heretical view. It was the Church Fathers who decided what was to be considered "The Bible," designating them as scriptural canon. In canon 85 of the Canons of the Holy and Renowned Apostles there is a list of all the books which are to be considered sacred and to be read in the Church. All the books that are in the Bible as we know it today are in this list, except the Book of Revelation. It was in 419 AD, at the Regional Council held in Carthage that the Book of Revelation was accepted as being canonical.

Meanwhile, during the fifth century a monumental task was under-way in Armenia.

Until then the Scriptures were read in Greek in the Armenian churches. Sts. Sahag and

Mesrob embarked upon the task of translating the Bible into Armenian. St. Mesrob found the necessary tool for doing this with the invention of the Armenian alphabet. The Armenian translation of the Bible has been referred to as the "Queen of Translations," because of its accuracy and style of perfection.

POMEGRANATE BLESSING SERVICE

Our new tradition continued on Sunday, January 2, 2022, when a Pomegranate Blessing Service was conducted following Badarak. In the Armenian tradition, the pomegranate, as a national symbol, reflects the meaning of life, prosperity and abundance. In Christian symbolism the pomegranate represents the blood shed by Jesus Christ, symbolizing also the Glorious Resurrection of our Lord and the diversity of God's grace.

In the interpretations of our church fathers, the pomegranate is presented that the church members are as diverse as the granules of the pomegranate but the pomegranate is covered by a solid peel, all being united in one Church. This Service is meant to be conducted within thirty minutes of the start of a new year, but for the sake of practicality, it has been done on the last Sunday of the year, or the first Sunday of the new year, whichever is closest to the first day of the new year. At the conclusion of the service, each family was given a pomegranate as a reminder of its Armenian and Christian symbolism.




