The mission of the Armenian Apostolic Orthodox Church is to preach the Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ and to proclaim its message of salvation. This mission is realized through worship, education, witness, service, and a common life in Christ as expressed in the distinctive faithexperience of the Armenian people. All the faithful of the Armenian Church – both clergy and laity – are called to participate fully in this mission.

I Desire Mercy, Not Sacrifice

Jesus said these words when He had dinner with tax collectors and sinners.

When the Pharisees saw this, they said to His disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?" But when He heard this, He said, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick Do. Go and learn what this means, 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' For I have come to call not the righteous but sinners" (Matthew 9:11-13).

In the Old Testament we read that people were offering many different kinds of sacrifices. But in the New Testament we learn that Christ is the Ultimate Sacrifice, who died on the cross for us and paid the penalty for our sins. That's why He said, "I desire mercy, and not sacrifice."

Now, let us see what Jesus expects from us when He says "I desire mercy, ...". The word "mercy" comes from the medieval Latin merced or merces, which means "price paid.". It has the connotation of forgiveness, benevolence and kindness. Mercy is often used in a religious context of giving alms, caring for the sick or the poor.


In the New Testament, we see several times how Jesus had compassion and showed His mercy to people; He gave sight to the blind, cured the sick and fed thousands of people. By His own life, Jesus not only gave us a great example of true mercy but He also gave us specific lessons how to be merciful.

'Come, you that are blessed by My Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; for I was hungry and you gave Me food, I was thirsty and you gave Me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed Me, I was naked and you gave Me clothing, I was sick and you took care of Me, I was in prison and you visited Me....'Truly just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to Me' (Matthew 23:31-40). This explains everything what we are supposed to do as Christians. These things are not hard to do; only we should have willingness to do them.

We all are sinners, even the saints were sinners. For example, in the Book of Lamentation, St. Gregory of Narek talks about his sins and mistakes. We sin knowingly or unknowingly, willingly or unwillingly and God knows about this. Which means we are not perfect since only God is perfect, but this doesn't mean that we can continue our mistakes. Every person should work hard to minimize those mistakes.

Dear parishioners, the good news is that Christ paid the penalty for our sins, He knows our shortcomings and He urges us to be merciful so we can inherit His kingdom and enjoy His presence forever and ever. Amen

A reflection on the Resurrection by Deacon Albert Keshgegian:


Praise the Lord, O Jerusalem!
Christ is risen from the dead!
Come O peoples, sing to the Lord: Alleluia!
(Glory to the Father and Son and Holy Spirit,
Now, and forever and ever, amen)
To him who is risen from the dead, alleluia!
To him who has enlightened the world, alleluia!

--Midday Hymn (just before Gospel Procession/Soorp Asdvadz), Divine Liturgy, Easter season

Some songs are memorable because of their musicality – their melody or rhythm, or both. Others we remember for their lyrics, which can be meaningful to our personal history, our own experiences or memories. Or the lyrics bring out in us strong emotions –happiness, sadness, love, regret. And then there are songs that are memorable both for their musicality and what they speak of.

Kovya Yeroosaghem uzder (above) is one of those songs or hymns that has it all. We hear it only a few times a year – on the Sundays from Easter to Ascension, but it always has a powerful effect on me and, I'm sure, on many others.

The hymn describes Christ as the enlightener of the world, as he described himself (John 8:12). Before Christ, humanity was lost in the darkness of sin; Christ came and taught us how we could come out of the chaos and confusion of darkness and into the certainty and serenity of God's light, of having God in the center of our lives, guiding us to his truth and to doing the work that is pleasing to him.



Of course, the hymn also speaks of the resurrection of Christ, the single most important event in the history of the world. That event offered us all the hope of eternal life with God. The hymn does not speak of that hope, but it is surely implied.

The hymn focuses instead on the reaction of humanity to the resurrection: come, peoples, sing to the lord, come and praise the lord ("alleluia")! The immense feelings of joy and thanksgiving shine so clearly.

But there is more. The melody of the hymn is upbeat and uplifting, reflecting the joyous, victorious feeling that Christians all share. In some Armenian churches on Easter day, there may even be a deacon highlighting the singing and melody with the playing of cymbals.

And there is even more! The line "to him who is risen from the dead" starts with high notes that come rapidly upon the heels of the previous line—it's as if we cannot contain ourselves with the happiness and joy that we feel.

It's hard to describe in words the feelings and emotions conveyed by both the message and music of this beautiful hymn. Make a point of listening to it carefully yourself sometime in church during the Easter season. You will feel anew what Easter and the Resurrection mean to us and greet each other with enthusiasm and devotion:

Kreesdos haryav ee merelotz! Christ has risen from the dead!

Orhnyal eh harootyoonun Kreesdosee! Blessed is the resurrection of Christ!




